

LT. COL DAVID W. SHOUP

1927 - 1996

Lt. Col. David W. Shoup, 68 of Lake Twp., passed away Sunday, April 21 at his home of an apparent heart attack.

He was born April 26, 1927 in Evanston, IL, son of the late Paul and Laura (Pendleton) Shoup. Mr. Shoup was a World War II, Korea and Vietnam War veteran. He served three Vietnam tours as a Forward Air Controller, Fighter Pilot (F-104s) and Commander of the 4800TFS (F-4s) at Danang and Phu Cat. His awards and decorations include the Good Conduct Medal, Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal w/17 Oak Leaf Clusters, Joint Service Medal, Bronze Star and World War II Victory Medal.

He retired from active duty from the 832 Air Division, Cannon AFB, New Mexico on Nov. 1, 1971 after 27 years of service and made his home in Lake Twp. near Caseville for the remainder of his life.

LTC Shoup was a member of St. Roch Catholic Church, Caseville, Experimental Aircraft Assn., Retired Officers Assn., Aircraft Owners and Pilots Assn., Bay and Huron Aviation Clubs and a charter member of the Experimental Aircraft Museum and the Air Force Museum.

Surviving are two brothers, James (Nancy) Shoup of Royal Oak and Paul C. Shoup of Caseville.

Memorial services will be conducted on Thursday, April 25 at 11 a.m. at St. Roch Catholic Church. Rev. Fr. Dennis Kucharczyk, pastor, will officiate with burial in Arlington National Cemetery, Washington D.C.
