There are times in our life that we feel down because of the many discouragements that we meet along the way. Many will throw discouraging words that sometimes make you feel like quitting the work you are in. And sometimes you get discouraged by your own weaknesses as well and you break down in tears and ask "Why I am here?" But actually God has a plan by putting you where you are now.

For almost three years I've been staying in Huai Fai Village, I have asked many times; "Why I am here?" And then to my pondering question, comes the answer, "God sent me here because the villagers need God's great love. I can still remember when my close friend said, "Is that missionary work an unending work? You've been a missionary before and now you are going to be a missionary again? Those words would flash back in my mind whenever I felt discouraged. But then I realized that the enemy was trying his best to hinder the work of the Lord. Now my partner and I continue to stay in Huai Fai though we experience ups and downs. We still pray for God's grace while we share the good news of salvation to the people around the village. My partner reminded me of a quote that inspired her to continue to be a missionary. "When the redeemed stand before God, precious souls will respond to their names who are there because of the faithful, patient efforts put forth in their behalf, the entreaties and earnest persuasions to flee to the Stronghold. Thus those, who in this world, have been laborers together with God will receive their reward," 8T 196&7

As of now, Sulad Elma and I are praying to have a Mien Bible written in Chinese language so that the spirit priest can understand more. They are using Chinese books when they have their ceremonies. We hope to have one at least for the spirit priest. May God bless us all and all of you who are always supporting us here in SULADS Thailand Ministry. Thank you for your constant prayers and support just to push the work of God while waiting for the coming of the Lord.

More than 30 years ago, the Chamula Indians in San Lorenzo dreamed big, and started a small Christian school in the mountains of south Mexico.

Today this school has grown to 12 grades, with students who are top achievers in state competitions.
