#### **Critters:**

Coyote activity in the neighborhood has been increasing, and the best way to prevent problems is to keep them wild and encourage their natural fear of people. Most of a coyote's diet is rodents, however they occasionally may decide a small pet is a good meal. Human-associated food increases the number of coyotes in an area. This can support, and changes their behavior in bad ways.

#### Coyote-Smart Tips

- Avoid feeding pets outside. If feeding pets outside is necessary, remove the bowl and any leftover food promptly.
- Do not let your pet outside alone, especially at night.
- Avoid walking your dog at sunrise and sunset hours, and keep them on a 6 ft non-retractable leash.
- If you encounter a coyote, stand tall and maintain eye contact. Be assertive and do not run. Haze (scare) the coyote until it leaves the area.
- Remove fallen fruit and rotting garden vegetables from the yard.
- Regularly clean areas around bird feeders and BBQs.
- Never compost meat or dairy
- Keep food waste in containers with tight-fitting lids, and only place outdoors the morning of trash collection.
- Close off openings under decks, sheds and foundations that might look like warm places to den.

**Geese:** Please do not feed the geese! We again have encouraged a flock to stay the winter.
