- The black hot air balloon at the Strasburg Homecomings. They couldn't stay to watch it launch since her dad had to get home to do the milking, but they saw it up in the air.
- Attending high school in Strasburg and leaving school during the day to get an ice cream cone at Slats Keller's store.
- Nona Belle Keller was a favorite high school teacher.
- After the railroad was discontinued through Strasburg, there were tractor pulls that ran along the railroad right of way. Men used to jump on the sled as it went down the track. The tractor pull area was close to her home after she married and moved to town.

Local family explains Child Foster Care

What is foster care? Foster care is a program where children, who are not in good homes or situations, are removed from their homes for their safety and wellbeing. These children are then placed into homes of people who have been licensed through the state, with the exception of kinship (family) placements. The foster care system is designed to be temporary with the expectation that parents can change, and the child(ren) can return home. Though the goal for the child(ren) is reunification with their families this does not always occur. When reunification is not appropriate, foster parents have the opportunity to adopt the child(ren).

What qualifications are required to become a foster parent? First and foremost, to be a loving, caring, and supportive person. These children have already been through so much in their short lives. They need an adult or adults who want to include them in their family. They want and need to feel loved and supported, not felt as a burden. Even though it is not an easy or simple process, foster care is such a rewarding and life changing experience not only for you but for the foster child(ren) as well.

Emotionally it is hard. The unknown of what will happen at the next court date is nerve-racking. Patiently waiting for answers to only receive more questions is frustrating. All the unforeseen circumstances dealing with the families is disheartening. However, a foster parent can make such an impact in the life of a child and that is all that matters. Keeping them safe and loved while their parents cannot is something so special.

Sometimes it's not only the child(ren) who you can impact. Some parents can and do change. As a foster parent, you can be a resource and influence in a parent's life. Even though there are many negative assumptions about parents who have children in foster care, not all stories are the same.



Each case is unique and as a foster parent you must choose to overlook the negative for the positive.

Our family has been blessed the last year and a half with four foster children placed in our home. Even through the heartache we loved



each unique circumstance. Sadly, on February 4, 2022, with the passing of Kyng'Stin, our 20-month-old foster child, our foster care journey has come to an end. We decided to end this chapter of our lives in order to heal and to see what God has in store for our family now. Even though we are no longer foster parents, our story does not end here. We have made some lifelong friendships along the way, and we will continue to support those who are on their foster care journey. If anyone

is ever interested in learning more about foster care, we would love to talk to you.
