Scholarship procedure guidelines:

1. Member of the NDHSRA – in good standing - **who have qualified to the ND State High School Finals at least once in their high school career. Those who have not qualified for state by your senior year, and are close to being in the top 24 should apply. Please put in your application. We would like applications turned in by May 7th, but if making the top 24 after New Salem, no application will be turned away. Applications that do not make the top 24 will be notified.**
2. Have a 2.00 GPA or better in High School. **Please attach a copy of transcript.**
3. Applicant must be a graduating senior in the current school year.
4. Applicant must plan on attending an accredited university, junior college or trade school the immediate fall semester after high school graduation.
5. Application is **due by May 7, 2018.**

6. All applicants must appear before scholarship committee for a personal interview. Time and location for the interview will be posted later.
7. Winners will be announced on Sunday of the ND State HS Rodeo Finals.
8. In case of a tie, it will be looked upon if applicant works both ends of the arena. Example: Boys – rough stock/time events; Girls – barrels; poles/goats; breakaway.

Scholarship funds will be received after the recipient shows proof of enrollment in the university, junior college, or trade school. The scholarship award check will be written to the recipient.
