# THE WI LEARNING

You will have seen from the latest edition of WI Life, that phase 1 of the new WI educational model – The WI Learning Hub, is to be launched on Wednesday 24th January. £2.75 million of the proceeds of the sale of Denman College will



fund this new education model. The first phase will provide online, flexible learning, accessible to all members, ensuring the legacy of Denman lives on and which meets the WI charitable object of advancing the education of women. The majority of these courses will be free and will be delivered in a range of formats.

In addition, later on, national grants are to be offered to Federations which will expand the WI's educational network regionally, meaning education can be accessed more easily at a local level, without significant travel or personal expense. SYFWI would therefore like to know what new skills YOU would like to learn once we have access to these Federation grants. Could it be that you want to expand your knowledge of creative crafts, the environment and nature, cookery/food, I.T./online safety/exploring the internet, exercise and wellbeing, history/family history – the list could go on! Please let us know by emailing the Federation office with your requests so that we are more prepared for when further detail is announced.

#### CATHERINE WATSON HIGH LEVELS WI

Catherine Watson sadly passed away on 21st November 2023. Catherine and her family moved into the area in 1971 and initially lived near Crowle. Her new neighbour, Lucy Barker, invited her to join the local WI – High Levels. Catherine made new friends very quickly and was soon on the Committee and in due course became a Trustee of the South Yorkshire Federation and thoroughly enjoyed chairing the Combined Arts Committee.

She was an active member of the Vermuyden Choir, always loved performing and reciting poetry – her Pam Ayres poem recitals were priceless. Throughout the 1990s, Marty Ward and Catherine led numerous visits to Romania with other SYFWI members to train and assist the women in crafts,

and how to run meetings and committees. Romanians never had the chance to learn such things under the Ceausescu regime. Catherine organised and ran the Centenary Celebration of the WI at Hatfield Church in 2015. She was Secretary of High Levels for over 20 years, took over as President after Lucy Barker and remained on the High Levels Committee until last year. Cath's commitment, knowledge, sense of humour and friendship will be very sadly missed by all who knew her. A Celebration of Life service is to be held for Catherine at Hatfield Church on Saturday 20th January at 11.30 am.
