# **Words from Our Pastor**My First Year at Trinity Church

#### **Greetings Everyone!**

It is an honor to say that I have been your pastor for one year now. As I look back on my first year at Trinity Church, which is also my first year as an ordained Presbyterian minister, I am thankful to God for allowing me to be at this church and use my gifts for service in our church.

Many colleagues and other pastors kept asking the same question: what was it like coming in as a new pastor during the pandemic? Maybe some of you have had that same thought! I can tell you that it was a unique experience arriving during this time. I got to know many of you as faces on screens for many months, which took some time getting used to. Luckily you all had names under your faces to help! We are reminded, in Romans 6:22-23, "But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage
