3. AFTER ACTION REPORT

MARCH 12, 2020 BY RON VAUGHAN, SECRETARY *Ten persons were present for our meeting.

*Treasurer Green reported he and Michael have not yet set up the new bank account for the club. Ron has provided a copy of the minutes from the Feb. meeting plus a copy of the SJVCWRT Constitution from 1994. Green reports \$1,080 in the bank, plus \$400 in cash.

*Discussion of our 2020 Conference plans. We discussed having a dessert for the Sat. Night Dinner. We have set aside 30 rooms. 10/15 is the deadline to cancel/confirm rooms. Room rate is \$109 per night.

*Program was by Mike Carter: He regretted that General Alexander was unable to attend tonight. Instead he gave a talk entitled: "Two Generals and a Lady."

First was Earl Van Dorn. He graduated from West Point in 1842, 52 in his class of 56. He was a veteran of the Mexican War. When the Civil War broke out, he resigned his commission and joined the Confederacy. He was Department Commander of the Trans-Mississippi and led the CSA Army to defeat at the battle of Pea Ridge. The army was ordered east of the Mississippi, and fought at Corinth and lost, but was successful in destroying Grant's supply base at Holly Springs. He spent some time at Spring Hillm where he frequently went riding with Mrs. Peters. Then one day Dr. Peters shot him dead!

The Second General was Benjamin Cheatham. He was a veteran of the Mexican War. When the Civil War broke out, joined the South, and he was appointed a Brigadier General. He led troops at Shiloh, and in Bragg's army, then with Hood's army. At the battle of Spring Hill, 1864, due to a comedy of errors in Hood's army, the battle sputtered out that night. Cheatham spent the night with Mrs. Peters, and nine months later she had a baby girl!
