



2017 Pecos Conference Site Tours Sunday August 13, 2017

1. Arroyo Hondo Pueblo

Leader: Dr. Jay Shapiro, Phone: Home: 505-989-4588; Mobile: 505-670-3999

Time: 9:30 a.m. Approximate end: 11:30 a.m. # of Participants: 25

Meeting Place: El Gancho's lower lot - the parking area directly on the left as you drive into driveway. Parking is limited, so car pooling STRONGLY encouraged.

Difficulty and Recommendations: Easy/moderate; some up and down walking over uneven ground. The tour circles the site, so one is never very far from cars. Wear hats and sturdy shoes. Sandals are not recommended. Bring water. No bathroom facilities on site.

Description: Arroyo Hondo is a large (1,000 rooms) 14th century Tewa Pueblo site of approximately 25 acres owned by the Archaeological Conservancy.

2. Glorieta Archaic Rock Art Panels (2 separate groups of 20 each).

Time: 9 a.m. Approximate end: noon # of Participants: 40 (2 groups of 20 each)

Meeting Place: Pecos Conference site – Registration Tent

Difficulty & Recommendations: Easy; Sites are easily accessible, with little walking, but the trip requires a high-clearance vehicle. Carpooling will be encouraged as parking is limited. Sunscreen, snacks, water and comfortable walking shoes are recommended.

Description: Explore two horizontal rock art panels on Glorieta Mesa, with petroglyphs dating to the middle-late archaic period (3300 -4000 B.C.) that are unique in design and location.

Meeting Place: Lone Butte Store: 3815 State Highway 14, Santa Fe, NM 87508

Description: Perhaps the largest pueblo ruin in the United States with possibly 2000 surface rooms and ten plazas. Includes the ruins of a mission church and convento.

Meeting Place: Lamy train station

Difficulty and Recommendations: We carpool directly to site; terrain is off-trail walking in arid vegetation. See warning below about footwear. From Lamy Train Station we will carpool to the site about 1.75 miles away.

Description: Manzanares Pueblo was a Coalition Period community with tree-ring data ranging between A.D. 1270 and 1304.

5. Lamy Junction Site, a Coalition Period (A.D. 1200-1350) site group

Meeting Place: Junction of US 285 and CR 33 (turn off to Lamy from U.S. 285) between where railroad tracks cross US 285 and the overpass over the Galisteo River.

Difficulty & Recommendations: Easy for those in moderate or better condition. Terrain fairly flat. Round-trip walking distance about 1 mile. Bring water, trekking poles, sturdy boots, sunscreen, open mind.

Description: The Lamy Junction Site consists of one dozen plus Coalition Period pueblos of various sizes (about four to 25 rooms each) that are grouped on a low terrace of the Galisteo River.

Description: Burnt Corn Pueblo (LA 359) is a moderate sized (9 structures/room blocks) Ancestral Puebloan site in the western Galisteo Basin dating to the Pindi Phase of the Coalition period.

Description Come join us for our 14th annual commemoration of Pueblo Independence Day. On August 10, 1680—the Pueblo People of New Mexico—aided by Apache and Navajo allies—launched a successful rebellion against Spanish colonization.

Commemorative activities will begin with a pilgrimage run from Walatowa plaza in Jemez Pueblo to Giusewa Pueblo kiva at Jemez Historic Site (approximately a half marathon or 13 miles). The run begins at 7:00 AM, and the general public is welcome to participate

The festivities, between 10:30 a.m. and 3 p.m., will feature: Jemez traditional dances and Native American flute music. There will also be authentic native arts and crafts and native food. There is no admission fee for any of the activities related to this event.
