Dear Folks,

The strangest, but ordinary circumstances will spur my thinking to ponder issues of church and faith. A few days ago, as I prepared to tackle the spring clean-up around my home, I was in a big box store struggling to load a large, heavy bag of garden soil onto the bottom of my cart. As the cart kept sliding away, I attempted to hold onto the cart and swing this bulky bag of soil. Apparently, I looked like I needed help, because this wonderful young woman asked if she could help me. Now, normally I tend to say, "That's ok, I can get it." But this time I only said, "Thank you!" and in a flash the bag was on the cart. As she walked away, I thought to myself, "She saw my gray hair and must have thought I was too old to do it." Yet as I continued shopping, I felt blessed by the unexpected gracious offer of help.

Fast forward to the loading of my car. As I loaded items from the top of the cart, a worker clearing empty shopping carts from the parking lot was looking my way. I thought he must be waiting for my cart, but no, he came over and offered to load the big, heavy bag of garden soil. Once again, I thought, boy, I must look like an old lady who needs help, but I said "yes, thank you."

Now maybe both these people were just gracious, helpful people. The young woman saw my struggle, but the man in the parking lot only saw me. I hadn't started to struggle yet! I wondered what role my age and gender played into their offers. I have never had 2 offers in one store trip before. I started thinking about the difference between how I saw myself and what the world sees. I felt competent to load my own purchases, but did the world see a gray hair old lady who perhaps had no clue how heavy that bag really was or was the

world just being gracious to me that day.

We are Easter people! We proclaim, "Alleluia! Christ is Risen!" We are the body of Christ in the world, sharing the gracious gift of God's unending love and forgiveness, given through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We know this. We know we are beloved children of God through our Baptism sent out to bear God's creative and redeeming word to all the world. But what does the world see? Do they see people who have a deep relationship with their Lord and Savior? Do they recognize us as Christians, caring for one another with that love? Do they know our mandate from Jesus himself is to go out into the world caring for those in need? Or do they see people who have a stale, dusty old religious social club? Who are unchanged by what they hear on a Sunday morning to make a difference in daily life? Who celebrate a hard to believe ancient story behind closed doors just as the disciples did that first Easter?

What impression do we as Christians and as faithful people of St. Paul's, Summer Hill give to the world around us? Is it the same impression we have of ourselves? Are we doing a good job of communicating God's Word of love among ourselves and out into the world? And if not, how might we change that?

We are an Easter people sent out into the world. We are to be Christ's hands and feet in serving others. Gray hair or not, in Christ there is no retirement program!

Alleluia! Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia!
