C. Long Beach Board of Education

The Long Beach Board of Education voted on April 13, to adopt the proposed 2021-2022 School Budget. The overall budget-to-budget change is a net decrease of \$411,822 from the current year and will result zero percent increase in the Long Beach Tax Levy. However, many homeowners may still see an increase to their school taxes because of the ongoing shift in tax burden from Zones 2, 3 and 4 to zone 1 (homeowners). The final budget and two School Board members will be voted on by the community on Tuesday, May 18.

G. Packing and Unpacking

If you are directed to pack up your room in anticipation of construction, summer school or summer camp you are entitled to be compensated for your efforts. The rate is \$25.91 per hour. However, your claim cannot exceed \$100. The work must be done outside of the school day and a record kept of the dates and times.

H. Eyeglass Reimbursement—Reminder

We are in year one of a two-year cycle for eyeglass/contact purchases. Members have \$400 to spend on glasses/contacts. On the form you will attest that the glasses are for your personal use. D. Political Action Committee – Jennifer Garrett

1. BOE elections and budget season are here! Once again the PAC committee would like to endorse the 2021-22 district budget. The proposed district budget brings new opportunities with a 0% tax levy increase.

Last year, PAC endorsed the budget via a postcard mailing, social media campaign, and Herald ads. Each was implemented successfully and received positive feedback. We also utilized a phone bank. After many conversations and considering the feedback from our callers, we have decided not to hold another phone bank this year.

For this year's budget vote, PAC will continue with our mailing. Nearly 5,000 postcards will be mailed to the expanded target group as last year. For our social media campaign, we intend to have a post to share that also utilizes the postcard design. I have asked the printer to create this as well. In conjunction with PR, PAC will run an ad in the Herald. Similarly to last year, we intended to utilize the postcard design.
