### STAND UP FOR GOD

Many folks don't want to be acknowledged for the gifts and time they share here at Immanuel & in the community doing ministry but at the same time I hope and pray that no one takes it for granted that someone else will "do it". We are all busy and challenged with life in general, let's help each other do the ministry God asks of us.

## **NWPA Green Team**



At last year's Synod Assembly it was voted by the assembly to authorize the formation of a new NWPA Synod Green Team. I share this information as we approach April 22<sup>nd</sup> — the day chosen nationally to celebrate Earth Day and on our church calendar as Creation Sunday. In being good stewards of God's creation, for us every day should be Earth Day! This year Earth Day is on Sunday a GREAT reason to take a little extra time to be thankful for this beautiful God-infused world we share with all other members of creation. Check out "Greener by the Minute" on the next page — from the NWPA Synod newsletter — an article by one of the new Green Team members and see what you can do to be a better steward of God's creation.

Greener By the Minute-NWPA Green Team

Recycling is only one way to be green. After you read these few suggestions, we bet you'll think of a hundred more ways to be GREENER BY THE MINUTE on your own! Now apply this to your workplace and worship space. Going GREEN saves GREEN!

- Reuse: Containers in the kitchen and for storage. Shop at thrift stores. You'll be surprised at what you find.
- Reduce: Use of paper throw-aways use cloth napkins, glass dishes (not paper plates), less wrapping paper. IF you do use paper... recycle. Use less detergents, less pesticides, less cleaning products, etc.
- Buy less. Repair instead of just throwing something away.
- Choose local meat from local farmers, not from factory farms. Try more vegetarian meals.
- Garden; grow your own herbs or vegetables. Container gardens work on the patio. Buy local produce at farmer's markets or directly from growers. Less manicured mown lawn, it doesn't have to be messy and unattractive - garden by planting native plants that attract pollinators.
- When buying appliances and computers, look for ecooptions and Energy Star.
- Buy in bulk and be aware of excess packaging. . . recycle as much packaging as you can.
- Only run the washing machine and dishwasher when you have a full load. Use cold water to wash dress clothes.
- Bring your own bottle or drink container...reduce use of plastic bottles, recycle.
- Bring your own bags when shopping. Don't take the plastic bags, not just at the grocery store. Don't use that plastic bags in the produce section.

- Line dry your clothes, reduce the use of your dryer. Clean out the lint filter in the dryer after every load. This will reduce the amount of energy used.
- Use green chemical free cleaning products i.e. Norwex and others. Use low-phosphate cleaners.
- When replacing or in new construction, use low flow toilets.
- Lower the thermostat on your water heater. Take shorter and cooler showers.
- Carpool, bicycle, or walk when possible. Buy a hybrid vehicle. Drive slower, keep the tires properly inflated, and don't accelerate and brake rapidly.
- Compost. You can compost in an apartment or in the city.
   Learn about worm compost bins.
- Set the thermostat a little cooler in the winter and a little warmer in the summer. Can you do without air conditioning? If you have a smart meter, pay attention to when the low-energy times are. Is your home insulated?
- Unplug everything; if you're not using an appliance, unplug it. This reduces energy use. Turn off the lights. Use automatic motion sensor switches.
- Go solar. You'll recoup the cost. Have you seen the new solar shingles?




