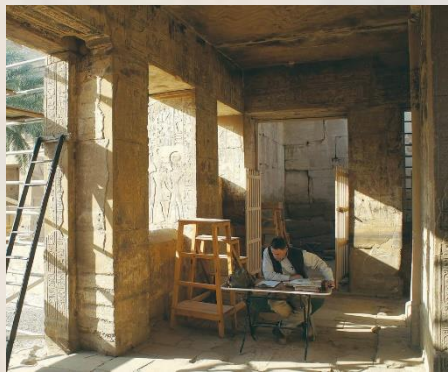

The mission of the Survey since its founding in 1924 has been to produce photographs and precise line drawings of the inscriptions and relief scenes on major temples and tombs at Luxor for publication.

More recently the Survey has expanded its program to include conservation, restoration, site management, and conservation training, and new digital drawing techniques have been integrated into our documentation program.

This lecture will show you the Current Research in the Small Temple of Amun at Medinet Habu, the temple dating to the 18<sup>th</sup> Dynasty.



The Epigraphic Survey of the Institute for the Study of Ancient Cultures of the University of Chicago, based at Chicago House in Luxor, Egypt, is directed by J. Brett McClain.

Dr. J. Brett McClain is a Research Associate of the Oriental Institute at the University of Chicago and Field Director of the Institute's Epigraphic Survey in Luxor, Egypt, where he has served on the expedition staff since 1998. A specialist in the hieroglyphic inscriptions of the Late and Greco-Roman periods, Dr. McClain is the author of numerous publications on ritual, cosmological, and commemorative texts, and he is currently working on the epigraphic documentation and publication of inscribed material from both standing and fragmentary Theban monuments of the New Kingdom, the Late and Ptolemaic dynasties, and the Roman era.
