On Saturday, Nov. 13<sup>th</sup>, at 11 AM St. Peter's will host the quarterly meeting of the local Society of St. Mary. We are the founding parish for the local Ward of the Society which is named "Our Lady of Perpetual Help." So what is Society of Mary and what exactly do we do at a meeting?

The Society of Mary is the result of a merger of two venerable Anglican devotional societies, the Confraternity of Our Lady founded in 1880, and the League of Our Lady founded in 1902, who joined together in 1962. The Society of Mary is Anglican in origin, and though its main regions are in England and the United States, its members also includes many non-Anglicans from around the world. Membership in the Society of Mary is open to all Christians from all traditions.

The objectives of the Society of Mary are 1. To love and honor Mary, 2. To spread devotion to her in reparation for past neglect and misunderstanding, and 3. To take Mary as a model in purity, personal relationships and family life. Members of the society keep a rule of life that includes traditional Marian devotions (such as the Angelus and the Rosary), intercession for the faithful departed members of the society, participation in Mass on the major Marian feasts and solemnities and active engagement in apostolic work. Official membership in the Society of Mary costs \$15 a year. The society also publishes a quarterly Newsletter entitled *Ave*. Local meetings of the Society of Mary take many different forms. One need not be an official member to attend a society meeting. Our chapter of the Society meets quarterly with two other parishes, St. Timothy's (ACNA) in Spring, Texas, and Holy Cross (ACC) in Cleveland, Texas. At our meetings we offer a time for private confession from 10:30-11:00AM, Mass at 11:00 AM, followed by the Rosary, a light lunch is provided, and a presentation is given on the Blessed Virgin Mary. Presentations range from Marian devotions to theology, and Marian apparitions.

If you are curious about the Society of Mary or want to learn more about the Rosary and the Blessed Virgin Mary, I encourage you to come to our Society meeting!
