



FROM THE PASTOR

November 3, 2019
Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time
Lk 19:1-10

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Zacchaeus is quite the climber in the crowd! Not only is this seen in his sycamore tree house, but also, his high running among the rich and powerful in Jericho's elite world. How do we know? He is a tax man (vs 2 says 'Chief Collector'), and everyone knows (for good or bad) the tax man! Also, he has great wealth and obviously his reputation preceded him because Jesus calls him by name with no prior introduction. But, the point of this little story of their meeting becomes the growth of God's kingdom and the resultant spreading around the fruit of Zacchaeus' conversion! It turns out that Jesus is the one 'out on a limb' associating with the powerful and corrupt of Jericho, which is seen in the crowd's response who grumbles in verse 19:7 "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." Zacchaeus socially climbs down to embrace Jesus and will be numbered from now on with the poor and power~~less~~ (and soon enough the persecuted, too, because the powerful are so threatened when one of their own stop playing-think of Zacchaeus' black book!-Who doesn't want tax returns released except the corrupt?) Undoubtedly, the bottom line is that another soul is saved in Zacchaeus, and a newfound credible witness of a conversion story is gained that may influence other elite power players. And Zacchaeus is a seriously industrious and creatively dynamic new evangelist himself!

If people talk gossip about Jesus simply going to Zacchaeus' house, how much more are they going to talk when they see the converted life and sincere example of Zacchaeus doing public penance for his financial crimes, and returning his 'grifted gains' and more, back to his victims? Each surprised recipient of Zacchaeus' 'payback' now has their own 'conversion thoughts' to consider. I bet they ask, "What is it about this preacher Jesus to change Zacchaeus? I need to look into this gospel that has converted this conniving thief Zacchaeus into a compassionate social worker!" My speculation has always been that there is a connection between the apostle Matthew and Zacchaeus because of them running together in tax collector circles. (I'm not saying, but a bird may have told me, that Matthew had been a lieutenant of Zacchaeus because a good 'chief-tax collector has to have a brave under him- Did Matthew make back alley connections between Jesus and Zacchaeus before their public meet in the Jericho street!) I'm off the subject now, but only Luke's gospel tells the story of Zacchaeus. However Matthew and Luke clearly have sources (Q?) for their writing which is unique to the two of them (they only have the Our Father & Sermon on Mount material). For anyone with time and interest, there are some fascinating leads to follow looking into Matthew and Zacchaeus' pre-gospel connections. Read & compare Matthew's own conversion story in Matthew 9:9-13. Interestingly, Matthew's name in Hebrew means 'gift'. Yet, I am perplexed (or am I?) why Matthew doesn't 'tell-all' about Zacchaeus in his own gospel! Again only Luke mentions Zacchaeus by name. But, today we are mostly concerned about the 360-turn in Zacchaeus' way of life that happens when he embraces Jesus!

Let's take a minute to inventory the 'collateral' proof of Zacchaeus' genuine conversion. Up front, he lays half his wealth on the table as a contribution to the poor (half!) Then, he promises to repay his extorted victims four times over. Even in the tax world, that is an extremely high penalty with accumulated interests! Yet, Zacchaeus commits to this rehabilitation program as a sign of his genuine commitment to being a disciple of Jesus! Back in Luke 9:23 Jesus had spelled out the conditions of discipleship: "Anyone who wishes to come after me, must deny himself and take up his cross daily, following me." To deny oneself means to willingly accept sacrifice for the benefit of others, and always opting for the harder path for oneself. Zacchaeus could have just fallen into the crowd and hid away his resources for a secure escape later in case Jesus didn't work out. But Zacchaeus doesn't do that. He buys in all the way with Jesus, taking up a new sacrificial way of life. Note that Jesus had also said about discipleship, in verse 9:25, "What profit is there for one to gain the whole world but lose or forfeit himself?" Zacchaeus had the world, but no soul, before meeting Jesus. Now, the only thing Zacchaeus is concerned with gaining/saving is 'Soul'!

Zacchaeus reminds me of a friend who one day wanted to settle up with the IRS, to make right his past omissions & evasions of tax payments, so he voluntarily entered an IRS 'tax amnesty program' to make amends and start over. He thought it would be a way of receiving a little mercy from the IRS. Abruptly his eyes were opened, when the first thing the IRS did was to freeze all his financial accounts without warning. So he had to rush all around, contacting & tracking down all his vendors & employees, explaining why his checks were bouncing all over the place. Maybe a helpful notice of immediate effects by the IR, or a week of grace by them would have courteously allowed his already transacted payments to employees and vendors to clear the bank and better fit the word 'amnesty' better. But of course, the IRS does use the word 'seize and freeze' to explain what they do. He felt it more like a 'grab' or 'jack'! But, most importantly, he did come clean and make amends, taking up a new way of life.
