We all thoroughly enjoyed playing, and the variety of ages and instruments made it a fun experience for the group, and hopefully for the church.

Our children made Christmas cards in Church School. Members brought fruit, nuts, candy, and cookies and then our children helped assemble Christmas baskets that included the cards they had made. These were distributed to folks who really appreciated both the baskets and the love behind them.

I could go on and on, but from the Hanging of the Greens to the Christmas Dinner and program to the beautiful Christmas Eve service, the month of December was special at First Baptist.

And yet it was a hard month for a lot of people. It was hard for those who have experienced loss. We had members in the hospital in Des Moines and Iowa City for extended stays with challenging health concerns, and this weighed heavily on many of us. I made more trips to the hospital in Des Moines in a couple of weeks than I had in the previous few years.

I was impressed that through all of this, people showed up. Many of you filled in for those who could not be there, taking on new roles. You visited folks in the hospital, made phone calls and sent cards and texts and emails, took care of household details for others, offered a place to stay for out of town hospital visitors, and offered lots of prayers. We expressed care and concern and did what we could to take care of one another. As much as the celebration, this too is a part of Christmas - and a part of what it is to be a community of faith.

I am praying for a happy, healthy, joyful New Year for all of you. And I know that in those times that are not 100% joyful, God will be with us still, and we can serve together and bless one another as the hands and feet of Christ.

Christian Sympathy


