

Lens Correction / Camera Calibration Settings In Lightroom

Lens Correction in Lightroom

Lens Corrections is a tool that allows fixing lens problems:

distortion

chromatic aberration

vignetting

Non-destructive

Applying Lens Correction to Images in Lightroom

In Lens Correction sub-module choose "Profile" tab and check both boxes:

Remove Chromatic Aberration

Enable Profile Corrections

"Lens Profile" will be automatically populated for most newer lenses (from EXIF data)

Why Should I Choose a Camera Calibration Setting?

Camera calibration settings tell LR how to interpret the color information in the pixels of the photo

LR defaults to Adobe Standard - a generic version developed by Adobe engineers (ignores camera settings)

Other settings based on the camera used to take the photo are included in LR (Nikon: Picture Control; Canon: Picture Style) Note: Imbedded in JPG files by camera

Built in versions include: Adobe Standard, Camera Landscape, Camera Neutral, Camera Portrait, Camera Standard, Camera Vivid (Nikon), Camera Faithful (Canon)

Choosing a Camera Calibration Setting

You can also create a custom calibration using tools like X Rite Color Checker based on your specific camera/lens combo

Calibration Setting Demo

LR Develop Module, Right Panel, Camera Calibration

Dropdown menu to make selection

Can be built in to presets applied during import to all photos

What are Lightroom Presets?

Presets are frequently used settings that are saved for future and easy use

Presets are included by Adobe as defaults, can be downloaded (created by others), or can be created by the user

Presets are handy tools that can streamline workflow, save steps, or assure consistent editing of similar images

Editing presets adjust sliders and can be used as starting points for further processing

Editing presets can be stacked as long as they don't affect the same sliders (e.g., B&W conversion and Vignette)

Types of Lightroom Presets

Develop

Adjustment Brush Export

Radial/Gradient Filters Watermark

Image Conversion Book Layout

Special Effects Printing

Metadata Identity Plate

Develop - Group of develop settings that can be easily applied to any photo. Created in Develop module left panel

Adjustment Brush - Settings to be applied as brush strokes are added. Created while Adjustment Brush dialog is open in Develop module right panel

Radial/Gradient Filters - Settings to be applied as filters are added. Created while Filter dialog is open in Develop module right panel

Image Conversion - Settings applied when converting image to B&W. Presets built in by Adobe

Special Effects - Settings applied to create special looks in your photo. Presets built in by Adobe

Metadata - Settings applied to photo metadata such as copyright, contact info, etc. Created in library module right panel

Import - Settings applied during import to LR, can include 1 Develop & 1 Metadata preset. Created in Import dialog bottom panel

Export - Settings applied during export from LR, can include 1 Watermark preset. Created in Export dialog box

Watermark - Applies your custom watermark during printing or export from LR. Created in Export dialog box or print module right panel

Book Layout - Create a layout for a book you may want to use again and save it as an auto layout preset in the book module right panel

Printing - Layout template or settings applied to prints sent directly from LR to your printer. Created in print module left panel

Identity Plate - Shows your own Logo or identity for your LR version. Also used to add Logo to prints, movies or slide shows. Created in Lightroom (Mac) or Edit (PC) menu (Demo in June)
