

Minutes of meeting of April 10, 1992

This being the first meeting in April, a nominating committee had to be voted upon. The results of the voting was as follows:


Charles Fontana-Chairman, Sal Fucinelli, Richard Reichart, Pete Antiaco, and Jim Thoma.
