Safety/Housekeeping Tip

How to make your windows sparkle with no streaks!

Mix equal parts white vinegar and water in a spray bottle. Spray on your window. Crumple up newspaper and rub it over the windows until the dirt disappears. Then dry with additional newspaper. It is best to clean your windows on a cloudy day as the heat from the sun will dry your cleaning solution too quickly.

***Don't use kerosine, or any type of solvent, as this will be harmful to the vinyl on your window.

Original Hot Irish Coffee

1 cup freshly brewed hot coffee

1 tablespoon brown sugar

1 jigger (1 1/2 oz or 3 Tablespoons) Irish Whiskey

Heavy cream, slightly whipped

Fill warmed glass coffee mug about 3/4 full with hot coffee. Add the brown sugar & stir until dissolved. Blend in Irish Whiskey. Top with a dollop of heavy cream. Serve Hot. Makes 1 mug.
