POT PLANTING taken from an article written by Mary Crowell for Golden Gardens

Why garden in containers? Many reasons. Containers are versatile, portable and utilitarian. They can be a great use of space while being decorative, an art form, an accent and a super use of recycled materials. Anything can be a container if it holds soil, drains well and is able to be out in the elements. Complementing the plants is key to a well-balanced scape, keeping in mind color, texture, size, proportion, shape and scale of plants to the container. It is fun to recycle oddities that can double as a pot, again mindful of the weight, size, portability and drainage of the container itself. Interesting containers could be 3-tier hanging veggie baskets, old small BBQs, black plastic oil pans, old shoes, old jello molds, metal dishware, garden gloves you can Varathane and then hang, broken vases, old wooden boxes, chimney flue-pipes, metal pails, wall pots, half barrels, old cans, sinks, tubs, hypertufa or concrete pots, making sure always there is drainage before planting. Successful container gardening depends on how often you water, the plants you choose, your climate and location, location location.
