

WEEKLY THOUGHTS 33rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME NOVEMBER 14th 2021

Dear Friends, welcome to the 33rd Sunday of the Liturgical Year. This means we have one Sunday to complete our journey of the Liturgical year- that will end next Sunday on the Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe. The new Liturgical year will begin with the First Sunday of Advent – that will prepare us to celebrate the first coming of Christ or the first Christmas.

Let us be thankful to God for his Spiritual nourishment through Word and Sacrament at his table received over this period. Let us be thankful for his loving and merciful care and providence.

The Readings of this Sunday basically focus on the end of time characterized by a great distress. The Prophet Daniel speaks of the salvation of God's people from a great distress by the intervention of Michael the great prince. He would save God's people from terror and will attain everlasting joy.

The Gospel Mk 13: 24-32 Jesus speaks about the last things and end of time that will precede the Second coming of Jesus. This will include; death, judgement either for heaven or hell. The Second coming will be marked by the following events; destruction of the Temple and cosmic events of changes in the light of the sun and moon with stars and planets diverted from their normal courses. Jesus will return in great power and glory.

Jesus calls upon us believers waiting for his coming to be vigilant and ever prepared to welcome him at his return. The best preparation expected of us is basically prayer. Let us be constant and regular at personal prayer.
