The church will be open for private prayer on weekdays during daylight hours.

Statement from Father Jim: Whilst regretting the ban on collective worship, the Bishop's call for us to come and pray at the times allowed for private prayer - St Anne's will be open on weekdays during daylight hours. We already know there are people with Covid-19 in our communities and the vulnerable need to be protected. We can't afford to be complacent. Also, below is the statement from the Catholic Bishops' Conference. On Wednesday Parliament passed into law the Regulations governing many aspects of activity in the whole of England until Wednesday, 2 December.

"These Regulations prohibit the gathering of people for communal worship in churches and other religious buildings.

Despite profound misgivings it is important that we, as responsible citizens, observe these Regulations, which have the force of law:"
