My principal research interests lie in the field of applied conservation ecology, specifically in examining biodiversity responses to anthropogenic landscape fragmentation. I am currently undertaking a PhD at Cardiff University investigating the impacts of palm oil agriculture on the spatial ecology, diet, and ecotoxicology of small carnivore species in Borneo. As the Assistant Scientific Officer of Danau Girang Field Centre, I am permanently stationed in the Lower Kinabatangan Wildlife Sanctuary in Sabah, Malaysian Borneo and work closely with the Sabah Wildlife Department. I am also a member of the IUCN/SSC Otter Specialist Group, and the acting Borneo OSG Coordinator. My future research plans are to build upon the foundations of my PhD to mitigate biodiversity losses from anthropogenic activities, with the goal of actively translating scientifically rigorous and novel investigative techniques into informed conservation strategies.
