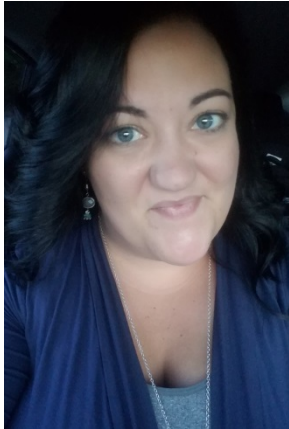


Caitlin Howison
