NOTES

1. BRING - P.T Gear, packed lunch, water bottle (canteen if issued), assignments (see note 4), a notebook & writing utensil.

2. UNIFORMS – Getting your uniform ready is an important part of preparing for drill. This includes ironing your clothes, shining your shoes/boots, sewing on the proper patches, and ensuring your hair meets the required guidelines. If you have any questions regarding these important requirements, the official Uniform Regulations may prove useful: (http://homeport.seacadets.org/display/Manuals/Uniform+Regulations).

3. ATTENDANCE – NSCC Regulations state that you must attend 75% of all scheduled drills. This amounts to a total absence allowance of five (5) drills per school year. If you do not meet this minimum standard, you will be administratively warned. If you continue to fail to meet minimum attendance standards, you will be discharged from the NSCC/NLCC.

4. CORRESPONDENCE COURSES – All NSCC Cadets are required to turn in at least two (2) BMRs or one (1) coursework assignment per drill. Correspondence courses, as well as the appropriate answer sheet, are located here: (<u>http://homeport.seacadets.org/display/CadetAdvance/Correspondence+Courses</u>). A reminder to those Cadets who have successfully completed Recruit Training: your advancement to E-2 will be delayed until you complete the BMR. Please go through your chain of command if you have any questions.
