

**“SLC SUMMER SERIES”**  
**Summer long horse competition**

- A. Three separate horse competitions shows in the series – each with the same format
  - 1. Proctor – during S. St. Louis County Fair
  - 2. Embarrass – stand alone event or incorporated in a regular show
  - 3. Chisholm – during St. Louis County Fair
  
- B. Format
  - 1. Three classes
    - a. Barrels
    - b. Pole Weaving
    - c. Speed Dash
  - 2. Three age groups per class
    - a. Pee Wees – 10 and under
    - b. Juniors – 11 to 13
    - c. Intermediate – 14 to 17
  
- C. Individual show prizes – awarded according to points earned in the show
  - 1. Awarded in each class to each age group
  - 2. Payout through 4<sup>th</sup> place
    - a. 1<sup>st</sup> - \$100.00
    - b. 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$75.00
    - c. 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$50.00
    - d. 4<sup>th</sup> - \$25.00
  - 3. Ribbons and points through 6<sup>th</sup> place
    - a. Number of points would correspond to placing ( 1<sup>st</sup> - 6 pts, 2<sup>nd</sup> – 5pts, etc)
  
- D. “Season winners” prizes – awarded according to total points accumulated during the series
  - 1. Awarded in each class to each age group
  - 2. Payout through 4<sup>th</sup> place
    - a. 1<sup>st</sup> - \$300.00 plus belt buckle
    - b. 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$225.00
    - c. 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$150.00
    - d. 4<sup>th</sup> - \$75.00
  - 3. Ribbons through 6<sup>th</sup> place

**SLC SUMMER SERIES  
HORSE SHOWS OVERVIEW**

- \* Three age groups: Pee Wees – 10 & under, Juniors – 11 -13, Intermediate – 14 -17
- \* Three classes: Barrels, Pole Weaving, Speed Dash
- \* Three shows in the series: Embarrass, Proctor, and Chisholm  
Tentative schedule: June 11th– Embarrass, July 9th– Proctor, August 13th – Chisholm (Proctor & Chisholm will be during the Fairs, Embarrass will be during a regular Club horse show)
- \* Entry fees will be charged: Pee Wee - \$1.00, Juniors - \$2.00, Intermediate - \$3.00
- \* If show already has the three classes and age groups that are in the series, participants can have their time count for both events as long as they have filled out the Series entry for and paid the Series entry fee.
- \* Show bills, tracking sheets, and payouts will be supplied by the St. Louis County Fair.
- \* St. Louis County Fair will send a representative to Embarrass and Proctor to do point tracking.
- \* All awards (cash, ribbons, & belt buckles) will be provided by the St. Louis County Fair.
- \* Banners will be provided by the St. Louis County Fair.
- \* “Season totals” awards will be presented at the St. Louis County Fair.

**S.L.C. SUMMER SERIES**  
**Rules for Exhibitors and Horses**

- 1.No stallions will be allowed to participate.
- 2.Each horse is to be accompanied by an original and a copy of a Coggins test, done within the last 12 months. The copy is to be given to S.L.C. Summer Series proctor, at the time of entry, and will not be returned.
- 3.Each rider and the owner of the horse being ridden in competition must sign a Liability Waiver. If the rider and/or owner of the horse is under the age of 18, their parent or legal guardian must sign the liability waiver.
- 4.S.L.C. Summer Series is for horses only. No other equine will be allowed to compete.
- 5.A horse may be ridden in each age group by a different rider.
- 6.In all classes, a contestant is allowed a maximum of one (1) minute to get to the ring after the class is called and/or their number is called. If more time is needed for tack change, etc., the ring master must be notified ahead of time.
- 7.No schooling is allowed during timed events.
- 8.Flat bats may be used, but rider must hit behind the cinch.
- 9.PeeWee contestants may be led around a pattern. However, their placing will not be above a contestant who rides the pattern by themselves.
- 10.All riders must wear riding boots while in the arena.
- 11.Riders must wear western shirts, jeans, and riding boots. It is suggested that western hats be worn by riders. However, baseball caps or no head wear is acceptable.
- 12.We recommend that any rider, 10 years and younger wear a riding helmet while competing.
