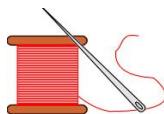

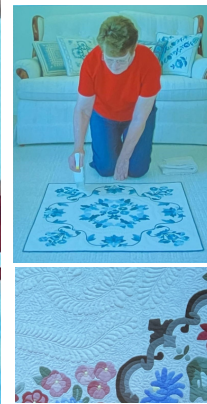
If you work with Zoom through work or other organizations and have advice to help me improve, I welcome your input.

Guild Meeting Minutes

August 28 , 2023

Hybrid meeting—in person and Zoom Virtual meeting

The meeting was called to order in the church at 7:04 PM.

Regina Scott Brooks started the meeting by reminding members that she had taken on the position of VP Planning and VP Programs in October of last year when there was only one month of meetings left in 2022, and she was scrambling in the cold winter months to set up programs for the 2023 calendar year. She contacted Betty Suiter, one of the few Master Quilters in the country and one of the guild's founding members, and she asked Betty if she would be willing to present a program in the 2023 calendar year. Betty said she would think about it and soon called Regina back to say yes, she would present a program. Regina was thrilled and decided then and there that it would be a good year.

Regina then introduced Betty who then gave a delightful, humorous and educational presentation with a slide show of her quilts, and also actual quilts. If you were at the meeting, take advantage of watching her lecture again.

At the end of Betty's lecture, Regina announced that we need one more School House presenter for October's meeting. If you're willing to show the guild members how to do something, please let Regina know. The guild's annual rummage sale will be held at the September meeting. You can bring your rummage sale items to the church as early as 3:00 PM. You can take your items to the \$1, \$5 and \$10 tables. Items over \$20 should be placed at the auction table. Bring your own bag to the sale as no bags for your purchases will be available. Credit cards will be accepted.

Autumn Latimore announced that the Food Pantry item for September will be cereal. The Holiday Party in November will again be at Reefpoint Brewhouse. It will again cost \$25 and there will be door prizes.

Quilt Show news: Ginger Wanserski said she needs two people from 12:00 – 2:00 PM the Friday before the quilt show to tape the floors for vendor booths. Cecelia Johnson needs set-up and take-down volunteers and 3-4 step stools. On Wednesday before the quilt show from 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM, people are needed to clean the poles that the quilts will be mounted on. Yvonne Parks has 70 items for the Boutique and needs a lot more. If you're making pin cushions or other items using nuts for the filling, please make a note of that on the item as there are many people with nut allergies. Dianna Zimmerman had flyers and yard signs in the parking lot after the meeting. Contact her if you want flyers or yard signs. Kathy Lejewski asked members to turn in the money from their raffle tickets. TC Wiley said she has 111 entries so far. All quilt entry forms must be postmarked by September 11. Vickie Madsen needs more people to sign up for judging, which will be Wednesday, October 4 from 11:00 AM-4:45 PM, and Thursday October 5 from 7:30 AM until 5:00 PM. Jean Veltman gave a rundown of signups and asked people to please sign up after the meeting. Many volunteers are still needed.

Pat Henningfeld listed the Board positions that still need people to fill them. The 2024 Board will be voted on at the October meeting. She reiterated that after being President for the past several years, she will not do it again and hopes that a President will step forward.

Show & Tell was presented and the meeting adjourned at 8:45 PM.

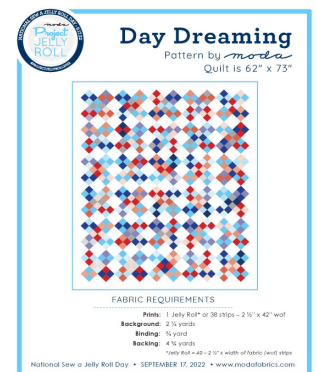

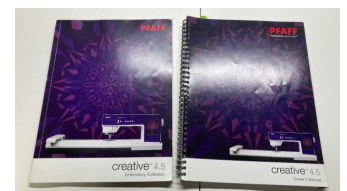
Charity Quilts need quilting?

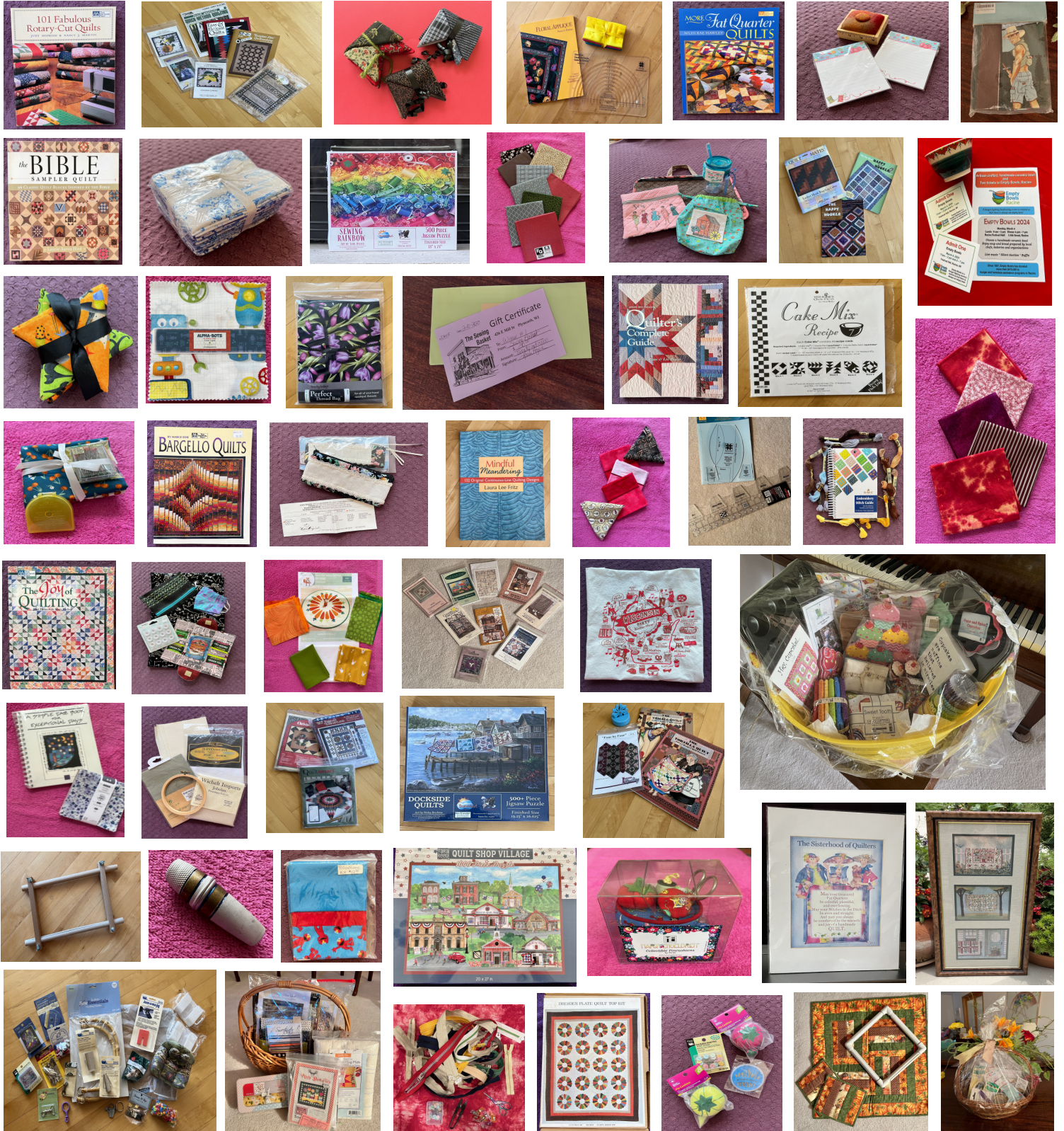

Lighthouse Legacies 2023's Featured Quilter is the effervescent TC Wiley! A 20+ year member of LHQ, TC is an enthusiastic ambassador for our guild and for the art of quilting. Here is her story!

As a little girl, I enjoyed sewing my own clothes and doll clothes, but I sure didn't know what a quilt was. In the early 1990's, my sister showed me her first mystery quilt. I told her that it would be a long time before you would see me cutting apart good fabric and then sewing it back together again. Boy! Was I wrong! Quilting started for me soon after that.

I joined Lighthouse Quilters Guild in the mid 1990's and that opened up a whole new world for me.



One of my first quilts was "We Love Our Green Bay Packers" in 1996. Check it out...it will be hanging in my booth. Oh what I have learned and achieved since then!

In 2004, I created the Elmwood Fabric Gallery for Jim Deibler of Sew 'n Save of Racine. I continued to manage this new entity until 2012 when it was time to retire to take care of family.

Since then, I have been involved in the 4H Quilting Program and facilitated several fun seasons along with my sidekick, Jennifer Clingaman. Alongside of this, I also manage the Quilts for Foster Kids program. The Wednesday Wannabes (a long time group of quiltsy ladies that started as a sub group of Lighthouse Quilters)



get a list of kid's names and we personalize a quilt for each foster child by embroidering their names on a pocket on the quilt back. The quilts, once all created by the Wednesday Wannabees, are now created by many groups within Racine and then finished and managed by the WW group.

My husband, Jim and I had a long-arming business (Creative Hands Quilting) for a little more than 20 yrs. Jim did the long-arming....We did the customer side of things together. I kept the schedule! Quilting and machine embroidery (which became an obsession in 2012 or so) are two things in my life that make me happy. I don't know what to say about my quilting addiction except that I tell people that I'll be taking my sewing machine with me when I go!

Lighthouse Quilters Guild

Lighthouse Quilters Guild was founded in 1981 by 15 women from Racine County who all shared a common interest - quilting. Because of the significance of this lighthouse to Racine, the guild chose to incorporate it into their name. They met monthly at each other's homes. Memberships grew rapidly as they relocated their meetings to Frankford in United Methodist Church. The meetings were used to work on projects and share ideas. The tradition of making a group quilt was started. This tradition continues with the quilt for the Lighthouse Legacies Quilt Show.

Although I was not interested in quilting, a trusted friend suggested attending a meeting with her. As a guest, I found myself intrigued by the quilt life interest not only in quilting but in the community and the friendship between members with a desire to learn more about their craft. I joined that night, 20 years ago. Through the years my interest has always been traditional quilting. There are only so many quilts you can gift to family and friends. These days, I had changed my focus to charity quilts, some of which are shared with the Prayer House Ministry at St. Luke Parish.

My membership has evolved into a continuing role as the guild as President and Publicity Chair. During COVID, the board had to quickly assess whether our guild would be able to continue to move forward or disband.



We did move forward as it continued our monthly meetings via Zoom for nearly two years. This allowed us the opportunity to welcome guest lecturers from around the world. A quilter from Australia was amazed with our name cover as we were amazed looking out her window at the sunset along our sandy beach. Lecturers included a retired police officer from New York City, a visit far away to a quilt as a Japanese textile factory and a quilter from California. Workshops also were promoted via Zoom.

At this time the guild meets monthly at Lutheran Church of the Resurrection, 323 Chicago. Membership is open to 120 quilters, eager to share their talents with Quilts for the VA Home in Union Grove, Foster Children's Project, Women's Resource Center, Housing and Adult Living Home at All Saints WIC and Children's Hospital. More than 5,000

quilts were made and donated to the military. The guild also supports service at the Racine County and Wisconsin State Fairs with ribbon and monetary awards. Meetings are held at 7 p.m. the last Monday of each month in Fellowship Hall.

Our membership ranges from 4-85 members to great grandmothers - all give minutes about quilting and serving their community. We continue to have nationally recognized quilters as our monthly speakers, some offering workshops. At present members donate food items at our monthly meeting to the Racine County Food Bank. Each month a different topic is chosen by our Hospitality Chair in conjunction with the Food Bank.

To further fund our various service projects the guild hosts a biennial quilt show with proceeds shared between the guild and area charities. Lighthouse Legacies Quilt Show with 240 entries

will be held October 7-8 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and 9 a.m. to 10 a.m. Sunday at Fountain Hall, 8005 Dorland Ave., Racine, WI. Admission is \$7 for adults and youth 10 and older. This is a judged show with monetary and ribbon awards in each category. Our raffish quilt "Jupiter Trellis" will be on display. Tickets are \$1 each or six

for \$5. We also will have raffish baskets with items not specifically related to quilting, boutique gift items, a vendor and an auction. The guild always welcomes new members at its various levels of quilting skills. Dues are \$30 annually. Prospective members are encouraged to attend a meeting with no obligation
