

BY LAWS OF THE Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc. ARTICLE VII

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- Creation and Formation.
- Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation.
- Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.
- Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.
- Washing of Feet.
- Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.
- Do not condone divorce and remarriage.
- Destruction of the Wicked
- Conditional Immortality.
- Rapture of the Man Child Class.
- Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.
- A ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not in consistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

The Broken Covenant

Using the Old Testament as an example as Paul has said in I Corinthians 10:1-12, we find that the Lord's primary way of dealing with men of faith has always been with covenants. The story in Jeremiah 34:8-22 of how Israel went back on a covenant shows how God is very merciful and slow to anger, but his word must be fulfilled.

A covenant or vow made with God is eternal; moreover, when God makes a covenant, either with commandment or by enlightening a saint to pray for or stand on a promise, it can be said that it is his perfect will. Some covenants are for all men at all times, like in Matthew 22:37-39 where Jesus sums up all the law and the prophets in the two commandments, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. While other covenants are for individuals, nations or races, as we see the Lord working in Israel.

A covenant made with a father of a nation or a leader of a people does not stop with the death of that man. This can easily be seen with the Lord's covenants with Abraham, Issac, Jacob and later Moses and Joshua. Nor were they binding on the Israelites who liked them, but also on the ones that did not. The only way that the Israelites could get out from under them was to leave Israel and become a citizen of another nation and thereby reject the covenants of their fathers. Other people from other nations could join Israel also and become full partakers of the covenant with God and their family was then counted among the Israelites.

The Lord is the same yesterday, today and forever, He never changes. So we know that the covenants made in our day are as binding as they were in Abraham's day.

The founder of the Apostolic Faith Movement, Charles F. Parham made a covenant with the Lord who was pleased with His servant. This can be clearly seen by the fruit that have come forth over the years. Now if there is a real hunger to have this movement continue, as I believe it is God's will to, we must go back and renew the covenant made by the founder of the Apostolic Faith Movement. Those who believe this is not important to do, do not understand how God looks on covenants. These promises made by the founder and truth revealed to him were not just the ideas of man, but clearly of the Holy Spirit. The rise of new age, humanism and eastern religions in the world today shows clearly that this message was to go out continually. Has Anyone Seen ... MY PARENTS ?

Hello everyone! I hope this letter finds you in good health and still working for the Lord. My name is J.R. Slater, I am 20 years old and a part-time student at the Apostolic Faith Bible College. This is an account of my experience during the last year and a half. Please do not take my words as a put down or an accusation. This is my testimony. It is not meant to sound bitter or spiteful in any way, shape or form. The content of this letter is dealing with the internet and it's effects on my family.

I was attending my first semester at AFBC (Apostolic Faith Bible College) when my parents decided to step into the 90's and bought a computer. I had been begging for years. When I moved away to college they finally got one. Weird huh? Well, at first the computer was just an expensive way to play a card game called Solitare. After a little coaxing from my sisters and I, we finally got access to the World-Wide Web or computer network called the Internet. I would drive home evenings to teach my parents how to look up information and surf the web. As I said earlier, there is nothing wrong with using the Internet. It is probably the best and fastest way to find information. That is what my parents did at first, then I showed them the chat rooms (places where you can write back and forth interactivily talking with someone who have be on the other side of the world). That is when our problems started. At first, we would joke about how my parents were addicted more than my sisters and I were. Then my mom started staying on longer and longer. About this same time My Grandma Slater became very ill and had to be put into a nursing home. She got very sick around Christmas time and my dad became very upset. We couldn't be contacted on her condition due to the phone line being tied up because my mom refused to get off the Internet. My grandma would ask for my mom to come see her, but mom never did. She told people at Grandma Stater's funeral that she wasn't feeling well and that's why she didn't come. They all knew the real reason. About this time, my parents started making "unscheduled" trips. They would go out and not return for hours. We would get phone calls from people we didn't know that would ask for our parents. They would ask who we were and then hang up when we told them.

Soon after Grandma Slater passed away, my Grandpa Cook came down with cancer and in a very short amount of time had become weak aand sick. He had to have intense radiation treatments. Either my uncle or I would have to take him for treatments because my mom was busy chatting on the *Internet*. At this point in time she was on for about 23 hours a day. The extra hour belonged to my dad. My dad would always tell my sisters and I not to be surprised if we woke up one morning and he had left.

One night when I came home late from work I came into the house and some of the lights were left on. I figured that someone may have forgotten to turn them

off, so I turned them off and went to bed. What I didn't know was that my dad was hiding in the closet and when I went to bed he left and caught a bus for Indiana. He contacted us about 2-3 weeks later and said he was happy and living with a woman he had met on the *Internet*. My mom became very upset and said she was going to find him. She left the day after Christmas on a bus. A week later she called us and said she was in Louisiana and she was living with a man she had met on the *Internet*.

As I stated earlier my Grandpa Cook had cancer and was slipping into the last stages. My Grandmother and I had to take care of him. It was just my Grandpa, Grandma, my two sisters (Ashley age seven and Candy age fifteen) and me.

It turned out that while my dad was here he built up quite a few bills. He took our truck to a title loan place and got \$250 for the title. He took the money to pay for the *Internet* service. He never paid it. I had to pay \$500 to get the truck back. On top of that I had to pay another \$500 + for other bills. I don't say this for sympathy, in the Bible it says that the Lord will take care of his people and provide for their needs. The day we found out about the bills and debt we also found out about God's provision. We started to get letters and cards containing money. The senders all said the same thing, "I don't know why I need to send this to you, but I felt you needed it." PRAISE GOD!

We started to think things were looking up until my Grandpa passed away this past spring. He was followed by my Aunt and Uncle. The death of my Grandpa Cook really hit me hard. I had lived with him and my Grandma Cook almost all of my life. That was a sad time for me.

You are probably thinking that it's still that way for me. Some think that our house is filled with sadness and depression. But it's not! In the past year we have laughed and we have cried, but we go on.

We realize now that our small family is precious and that God will provide. There are many things that have happened in our family. Some have to do with the *Internet*, some do not.

When I was asked to write this I was nervous, but I realized that there are others out there dealing with this same problem in their households. I hope this will enlighten you and allow people to see what the *Internet* can do when not used right, both personally and to families.

The next time your child wants you to help them read a book or just talk and hang-out and you want to log-on instead ... think about my testimony. Please! God bless you and may He keep His arms around you real tight.

A Letter From The Bride

I would like to thank you all for your prayers for me this past summer. It's not every summer that a person gets to plan their wedding, let alone have two broken wrists, but that was my experience. As you may know, on June 29, 1999 while helping my father, Randall Bensch, stack alfalfa hay bales in our barn, I fell off the hay truck sustaining injuries to both of my wrists. The injuries to my right wrist were more severe. There was a hairline fracture in my left wrist and three significant breaks in my right wrist. I went to an orothopedic surgeon in Shattuck, Ok. to have him set the breaks. As it turned out, it took three minor surgeries to get it right, but the Lord was with me all of the way. It can be discouraging to hear that another surgery is needed to correct the problem, but God's people were praying and I came through them all with few or no side effects.

The Tuesday after Camp Meeting the cast on my left arm was removed and on Aug. 31 the pins were removed from my right arm and a brace put on instead. It was very encouraging to know I could walk down the isle in my wedding without pins in my arm. I am very thankful for all of you that prayed for me during that time. I feel as if I have learned some very valuable lessons from this experience and thank the Lord that He is still our Great Physican!

Request For Help

Nov. 22, 1999

My nephew, Calvin Klaus, sent me the enclosed letter via e-mail and asked if I would send it on to church pastors who might be concerned and willing to convey to their congregations the desperate needs of the churches and ministry in Moldova. Timing is critically important as funds must be available to shop for and secure the needed supplies before the end of the year. The US Embassy has warned Americans to expect a breakdown in banking and communications, as well as in utilities in

that country.

Also, another very urgent prayer request: Mohammed and Faten Abdalla (personal friends of our daughter Sherri and her family and also of my husband and me) and their two small children are Egyptian refugees in Lebanon. Mohammed is a converted Muslim who has literally given up everything (his family, citizenship in his homeland, and their possessions) because he has refused to recant his faith in Jesus. His own brothers have vowed to kill him, and his escape from Egypt was nothing short of a miracle! He has no work permit in Lebanon. He will almost certainly be killed if he is forced to return to Egypt. They have been granted permission to immigrate to Canada; if they had the necessary funds to exit Lebanon before the end of the year, they could immigrate prior to Y2K and the potential problems to Lebanon in that event. After January 1, they will be placed on a waiting list with the Canadian Embassy, and their departure will be uncertain. The total amount needed for plane fares for the four of them, and entrance fees required by the Canadian government, is approximately \$5,000 - a little over \$2,000 has already been given. Perhaps someone in your congregation would be moved with compassion to help this family. If so, funds may be sent to Perryton Full Gospel Church, Box 845, Perryton, TX 79070 and designated for "Mohammed."

I am very much aware of how great the needs are, but I know God gives to us that we may give back into His hands by giving to others. Sometimes we can't give because we don't know the needs. The purpose of these letters is to let God's people know what some of our brothers and sisters in Christ need and are enduring. May God bless you and yours this holiday season!

Moldova, Russa

Nov. 21, 1999

Day before yesterday, the government fell in Moldova. There was a vote of no confidence. The Parliament has ten days to place a new government, or the president will place it. The majority party is Communist. If they make the government - or if the president does - it will be bad. The IMF, International Monetary Fund, was to release a large amount of funds to Moldova to help pay for its natural gas debt, which would allow for heat and electricity this winter. However, the IMF will not release funds to either of these new governments.

For the first time since I have been here, the electricity is being turned off for long periods for energy rationing throughout Chisinau, the capitol city. For many, like me, electricity is the only way to heat and cook. Over half the city has natural gas in the apartments but, for the first time, it is also being cut off.

We are facing a new unexpected and unplanned problem - and with this problem, NEEDS. I want to try to

communicate that the Church in Moldova is facing some very urgent and drastic situations. I want to ask if you will give the Body of Christ at your church the opportunity to hear of the situation and need, and allow the Lord to move as He will.

I am responsible for some major areas of ministry including street children, a new church planting in Balti (the second largest city in Moldova), a home for children, and in helping some of the other newly planted churches. There are new and specific needs in each of these areas.

The new church in Balti needs a small generator - \$900. The home for children needs a small generator - \$900.

A little stronger generator for use this winter with outreach teams that I support to do programs in the orphanages and small churches - \$1,200.

Blankets, clothing and bedding for street children and poor (to be made in the sewing room) - \$1,000.

Oil lamps and candles to help street children and the elderly. They will not have 1 lei (8 cents) to pay for a candle this winter. A retired person is paid 40 lei a month, but most have not been paid for a year or two; they cannot afford extra blankets or candles - \$1,000.

Rechargeable lamps with small fluorescent bulbs needed in various areas of my personal ministry with children and church planting - \$400.

Rechargeable lamps for some of the small outreach churches that we have started. We have over 20 planted churches, about 26 preaching points. The majority of the churches could at least have lighting for church (even though they must dress for the cold) if each church had two lamps; the lamps cost about \$35-\$40 each ... cost of 40 lamps would be about \$1,500.

Five of the new planted churches need generators; they are bringing many to the Lord and the churches are very active with youth nights, children's ministries, Bible studies, and regular church services. Cost for generators is about \$900 each + the need of cable, halogen will be about \$100 per church. Total need - \$5,000.

Whatever happens, my desire is to see basic ministry and key ministry continue. Yesterday a \$9,000 need was met for a large generator for the Seminary, praise the Lord! This was critical for the uninterrupted training of young men to preach the Gospel, plant new churches, and pastor ... this need was met in response to a request to help Doru that was sent to a friend of the ministry here. The Seminary also houses three congregations (Romanian, Russian, and deaf ministry), the street children's ministry and feeding program, a Christian school, medical clinic, dental clinic, and training center. Praise the Lord for His blessing!

With expected Y2K problems in Eastern Europe and Russia, there is a very real possibility that electric supply, natural gas, trains, some medical equipment, and banking will stop for some time. One survey said that at least 40% of the electricity and gas sources will fail in Russia; they will not export if Russia does not have sufficient

supplies. Moldova is totally dependent on Russia, for energy (natural gas). The central hot water heating system to thousands of large apartments in Chisinau and in Balti is heated with gas supplied by Russia; the electricity is also affected in the same way by natural gas and coal supplied by Russia.

The US Embassy has started a voluntary evacuation of nonessential personnel. Yesterday they called in all the US citizens for a briefing. They suggested a large list of things we should get and store - and that before January 1, we should have two months of cash on hand as the banks might not be able to transfer money or will lose our account information. The Ambassador said that we (Americans) have it better than the people of Moldova and that These problems will not affect us as quickly or as severely. There was another missionary family present who smiled just as I did. We are here living with the people on their level, unlike many Americans who come with big companies or through government contracts.

Whatever happens, I am here to continue to help train workers for the ministry, plant new churches, and help change the lives of children for Jesus. Thank the Lord for providing a few good sleeping bags from Alaska two years ago; they make this commitment a little easier. The Lord knows my unexpected needs and I know He will supply them.

I know this is a large list of needs and in some ways, I feel uncomfortable sending it - but I am only one member of the Body of Christ I know there are single members who, alone, can - with great joy - supply this need; I also know that there are many other members who can work together to help meet the needs. If you feel the liberty to share this need with your church, I will be thankful. All I ask is that this need be brought before the Body of Christ without a great plea, but just to let the believers know about the situation here and to give them the opportunity to share in meeting the needs if the Lord moves on their hearts. If he supplies none, Praise His Name! If He supplies part, Praise His Name! If He supplies all, Praise His Name! Kenneth Gale Doty

Kenneth Gale Doty was born on June 21, 1928 in Alief, Tx. He went out of this life free of pain on Oct. 23, 1999 at the age of 71. He is survived by a loving, Christian wife, Lola Belle, two sons, David and Obe, two daughters, Linda and Brenda, 13 grandchildren and 1 great grandchild. He loved his family very much and always asked about the one that didn't show up for a family get-together.

In 1958 they moved to a little house on the bayou in Liverpool, Tx. They always told their kids not to go too close to the bayou and to watch for alligators. They moved to their new home on the outskirts of Alvin in June of 1960.

Kenneth was an avid farmer and rancher. He was rated as the best farmer in the area in his time, outcropping even the farmers that went to college to learn to farm. His son, Obe now carries on that tradition.

Kenneth served as a Board of Director for the Apostolic Faith Church for many years. He also held position of Trustee. He resigned from the Board of Directors in 1980 after suffering his first heart attack. Kenneth and Lola Belle were faithful members of the Trinity Apostolic Faith Church for many years. They attended the Gonzales church whenever they couldn't make it home for services in Alvin.

Kenneth enjoyed Bluegrass music. He and Lola Belle attended Bluegrass festivals and weekend singings whenever possible. They would take their lawn chairs, if outside, and their ice chest with their tea to drink. They met many dear and close friends that they still keep in contact with in between singings.

If they didn't show up at the singings the friends would call to see what was wrong and was Kenneth okay. That showed what kind of an impression they had on people.

Kenneth ate his second and last supper at 9 P.M., Friday night. He told the nurse he was getting ready for

his trip because he was going home Saturday. He did! We know today that Kenneth is with the Lord, because he was a Christian when he passed away. His wish today would be that each and every one of his family members would be saved so they could see him in Heaven when that time comes.

Erman Weldon "E.W." Dickson

Erman W. Dickson, Spearman, Tx. passed from this life Dec. 21, 1998, at the Hansford Manor, Spearman, Tx. following a lengthy illness. Bro. Dickson's mind was clear and pretty sharp until about two weeks before his death when he suffered a stroke. He was born Oct. 8, 1906 in Colum-

bia County, Ar. near Magnolia, to Charles T. and Ida H. Dickson.

On Sept. 2, 1928 he was united in marriage to Cladys Ward, who preceded him in death June 6, 1964, in Pasadena, Tx. To this union was born one daughter, Myra Fern and one son, Weldon Ward "Sonny". Captain Teri Dickson-Riggleman and husband Captain Edison Riggleman, Colorado Springs, Co. and Jodi Dickson, Dallas, Tx.

Memorial services were conducted in the Apostolic Faith Church, Spearman, Texas, Dec. 23, 1998 by Rev, Marcus Adair and Pastor James Brown.
