Miracles of Jesus: Jesus Healed the Lepers and Me By Michelle Anderson

This article will highlight Jesus' healing lepers, in the Bible there are two miracles where Jesus healed people with leprosy. A miracle is defined as an extraordinary event manifesting divine intervention in human affairs. Jesus was and is in the miracle business. In the Bible, there is no disease that ostracized people more than leprosy, people were afraid of lepers. People with leprosy were forced to live alone and away from society, they were social outcasts. In *Numbers 5:2*, it illustrates how lepers had to be removed from camp, "Command the people of Israel to remove from the camp anyone who has a skin disease or a discharge, or who has become ceremonially unclean by touching a dead person." Also, in Leviticus 13:46, it states how lepers had to be isolated, "As long as the serious disease lasts, they will be ceremonially unclean. They must live in isolation in their place outside the camp." In addition to being deemed physically unclean, they were also declared spiritually unclean. This meant that they were unworthy to worship or praise God. Jesus did not see the lepers as unclean. He treated people with leprosy with compassion, and He did not look at them with disgust or fear.

The miracle of the leper being healed by Jesus was illustrated in three of the Gospels, *Mark 1:40-45*, *Matthew 8:1-3* and *Luke 5:12-15*. Jesus also healed ten men of leprosy; this miracle is told in *Luke 17:11-19*. The significance of healing the man with leprosy was to restore the leper's social stance which gave him new meaning to life and to clean the leper spiritually and physically. The significance of healing the ten lepers was the lepers needed to be obedient and have faith. Jesus did not heal them first, He told them to go see the priest while they still had leprosy, then on their way to the priest they were healed. In Merriam-Webster Dictionary, *faith is defined as belief and trust in and loyalty to God; firm belief in something for which there is no proof; complete trust; something that is believed especially with strong conviction.* The ten lepers had to have faith when Jesus told them to go see the priest, they had to trust in what they could not prove or had not seen yet.

In Mark 1:40-45, Mark was probably speaking to the Gentile Christians and telling them of how Jesus healed the leper. "A man with leprosy came and knelt in front of Jesus, begging to be healed. 'If you are willing, you can heal me and make me clean,' he said. Moved with compassion, Jesus reached out and touched him. If an willing, he said. 'Be tradical' Instantly the leprosy disappeared, and the man was healed. Then Jesus sent him on his way with a stern warning: 'Don't tall anyone about this. Instantl, go to the priest and let him examine you. Take along the offering required in the law of lines the three who have been healed of leprosy. This will be a public testimony that you have been aleased." But the man went and spread the word, proclaiming to everyone what had happened. As a result, large crowds soon surrounded Jesus, and He couldn't publicly enter a town anywhere. He had to stay out in the secluded places, but people from everywhere kept coming to Him."

Luke's account of Jesus healing the leper is illustrated in *Luke 5:12-15*. Luke was a Gentile physician and missionary companion of Paul. Luke was sharing this miracle with Theophilus. Theophilus was a literate, thoughtful Greek, and Luke wants to show him the greatness of Jesus, that he really is the incarnate Lord of glory. Luke wants Theophilus to know that Jesus healed the leper. Here is Luke's account. "In one of the villages, Jesus met a man with an advanced case of leprosy. When the man saw Jesus, he bowed with his face to the ground, begging to be healed. 'Lord,' he said, 'if you are willing, you can heal me and make me clean.' Jesus reached out and touched him. If an willing," he said. 'Be liceled!' And instantly the leprosy disappeared. Then Jesus instructed him not to tell anyone what had happened. He said, 'So to the priest and let him examine you. This along the offering required in the law of blooses for those who have been localed of leprosy. This will be a public testimony that you have been cleaned." But despite Jesus' instructions, the report of His power spread even faster, and vast crowds came to hear Him preach and to be healed of their diseases."

The healing of this man with leprosy was also told in *Matthew 8:1-3*. Matthew was speaking to the Greek speaking Jewish Christians. In Matthew's account he does not mention that the man had to go to the priest. "Large crowds followed Jesus as He came down the mountainside. Suddenly, a man with leprosy approached Him and knelt before Him. 'Lord,' the man said, 'if you are willing, you can heal me and make me clean.' Jesus reached out and touched him. Tam willing, he said. Balant And instantly the leprosy disappeared."

The significance of these Scriptures is that by healing the man of leprosy Jesus was restoring his social stance which would give new meaning to this man's life. He would not be an outcast, he could return to living with others, and praise and worship God. Jesus did not shun or avoid the leper when the leper approached Jesus. The leper had no right to have spoken to Jesus. The leper was supposed to keep his distance from society. Jesus showed the man compassion and stopped and listened to the leper's request. Jesus understood the desperation this man had. Jesus reached out and touched him, and the leper was instantly healed. In Merriam-Websters dictionary, compassion is defined as a sympathetic consciousness of others' distress together with a desire to alleviate it. That is exactly what Jesus did, not only for this man with leprosy, but for all of humanity. Jesus also showed the leper mercy. Mercy is defined as compassion or forbearance

shown especially to an offender or to one subject to one's power; lenient compassionate treatment; a blessing that is an act of divine favor or compassion; compassionate treatment of those in distress. "Compassionate treatment of those in distress" this definition describes Jesus' interaction with this man, it also describes how He interacts with us on a daily basis. In the Old Testament, it illustrates how lepers were outcasts. Lepers had to call out, "Unclean, unclean," when anyone approached them. In Leviticus 13:45 it states, "Those who suffer from a serious skin disease must tear their clothing and leave their hair uncombed. They must cover their mouth and call out, 'Unclean! Unclean!'" To Jesus the leper was not unclean; he was a human soul in desperate need of healing. Jesus is the one that truly made the lepers clean, both spiritually and physically. In the article Jesus Heals the Leper and What It Means Spiritually written by Vanessa Barthelmes, she states, "Jesus blessed the leper and used the words 'be clean' He was not only talking about his physical body He was also healing the leper to be clean spiritually in God's eyes." Once the man was healed, Jesus instructed the leper to go to the priest and offer a sacrifice.

When Jesus healed the ten lepers, Jesus also told them to go to the priests. In Luke 17:11-19, Luke tells of Jesus' healing the ten men with Leprosy. Luke's audience is Theophilus. "As Jesus continued on toward Jerusalem, He reached the border between Galilee and Samaria. As He entered a village there, ten men with leprosy stood at a distance, crying out, 'Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!' He looked at them and said, 'So show yourselves to the priests.' And as they went, they were cleansed of their leprosy. One of them, when he saw that he was healed, came back to Jesus, shouting, 'Praise God!' He fell to the ground at Jesus' feet, thanking Him for what He had done. This man was a Samaritan. Jesus asked, 'Dish't I had tan man? What are the other nitro? Has no one returned to give glary to Sad smaght this foreigner?" And Jesus said to the man, 'Stand up and go. Your faith has healed you."

When Jesus healed the man from leprosy, it was immediate upon Jesus touching the man. The contrast in the story when Jesus healed the ten lepers is that the lepers were healed when they left to go to the priests. Their healing was in their obedience to do what Jesus told them to do. Their obedience was required to see the manifestation of the miracle. These men had to be obedient and have faith in what Jesus instructed them to do. Obedient is defined as being submissive to the restraint or command of authority; willing to obey.

The similarity between the two miracle accounts of Jesus healing people with leprosy is that in both healing the man and the ten men, Jesus asked them to go to the priest. The significance here is that by going to the priest they could fulfill the law; the priest could examine them and declare them clean. This declaration would make them physically and spiritually clean according to society's law at the time. In *Leviticus 13:3*, the Bible states, "The priest will examine the affected area of the skin." In *Leviticus 13-14*, the Bible instructs people how to handle people with skin diseases. Jesus wanted the leper to obey the human law, and this was a public testimony that showed that the leper had been cleansed, and this would restore his social status. (Mark 1:44) Jesus commanded the lepers to go to the priest, so the priest could verify that the men no longer had leprosy. This followed the instruction in *Leviticus 13-14*, where there is instruction on how the priests examined the skin to determine if a person was clean or unclean. The priests would examine them to verify the cure. Then the lepers would be declared clean.

The Bible is written using many real-life stories, these stories parallel our lives and touch us emotionally. They show us how that being obedient and having faith in God and Jesus worked in the lives of people 2,000 years ago, and that if we have the same measure of faith and obedience, God and Jesus can work in our lives today. That is why the miracles of Jesus healing the lepers speaks to me because I was healed of eczema after I was saved. I had severe eczema for 39 years, it was all over my face, neck, chest, arms, and legs, it caused me great physical and emotional discomfort. I felt like the lepers felt in the Bible, I felt like an outcast and at times, I did not want to be around people, because I thought people either felt sorry for me or were disgusted or shocked by my appearance.

When I got saved, I heard Dr. Tom Anderson teach on healing, the power of our words, and confessing Scripture. When I read about Jesus healing the lepers, I knew that healing was for me too. At this time, it was revealed to me that I needed to be obedient, just like the leper had to be obedient when Jesus told him to go and give the offering to the priest. Not long after I was saved, I went to an allergist, and he tested me to determine what I was allergic to. I found out that I was allergic to almost everything in the environment, dust, pollen, grass, trees, dander and so much more. I also learned that I was allergic to corn, wheat, all tree nuts, peanuts, sesame seeds, tomatoes, bananas, strawberries, and latex. The allergist said that you cannot control the environment, but you can control your food intake, he told me to eliminate all these foods from my diet. That is where my obedience came in, I had to eliminate these foods from my diet, and I did. Within in three months, I was 90% healed. I had some residual redness and itchiness and I spoke with God and said, "I believe Your Word and I believe Jesus died on the Cross for me to be 100% healed. I am not being vain Lord I am standing on Your promise that I am made in Your likeness and image. You have given me a ministry and You know how uncomfortable I am speaking in front of people when I am broken out. If this is what You want me to do, then I want this 100% gone." God

Ezekiel 1:1-28

Why did the Jewish people in Babylonian need a prophet? God wanted Ezekiel to:

- 4) Call the people to a new awareness of their dependence upon God. (1:1)

For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin. Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." (2:18)

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revealed to me that there was another vice that I needed to remove from my life, it was something that did not even mean anything to me, I was not even aware of the significance of why it was blocking my complete healing. As a result, large crowds soon surrounded Jesus." I have a desire for large crowds to surround Jesus, and for them to know that miracles happen today.



Second Chance At life

Well, I really need to start off by telling you some of my history. I am 52 years old. I started my criminal activities in 1984 from 1984 to 1987 I was in and out of Arizona Youth Authority. When I graduated from high school, I went to N.A.U. for my generals and finished my schooling at the U.T.I. I retained a master's in automotive.

When I finished there, I moved to Colorado and then to Utah, where I soon went to jail and then prison. I went to prison in 1988 and remained there until 2011. In 2002, on my last attempt to parole, I was convicted of a sex crime, "Peeing outside of a bar". So of course, also in 2002, I had to step down from my rank in a 'white' gang I'd been in for several years.

That crime changed my whole entire life, I just didn't know it yet! I moved from Salt Lake City, Utah to Iowa, in 2013, to avoid the Gang Task Force! I tried to outrun the registry, but that didn't work. I was picked up 21 days later in Des Moines, Iowa. I was found guilty of failure to register. I went back to prison for 27 months. After my release I violated five times. The last time I was at a halfway house where I got high. Next thing I know the halfway house gave me a urine test and I was, you guessed it, guilty!

I let the Meth control me! So, I packed up all of my clothes in a backpack and went on the run. I was gone for almost 18 months. That's when I was caught and arrested, in Phoenix, and taken back to Iowa. I plead guilty not knowing I had picked up a new indictment. They gave me 18 months for the violation, and 8 months into that violation they took me to Des Moines for the indictment. I was found guilty of double jeopardy and given 30 more months.

When I left the jail, they sent me back to prison in Memphis C.C.A./Core civic. After I was there for 15 days 6 gang members assaulted me and I laid in my own fluids for 11.5 hours. When I was taken to a hospital 3 hours away, they found a faint pulse and the Lord gave me a second chance. From that beating I received a T.B.I., (traumatic brain injury). This is why I expounded on the "Second Chance at Life" ... C.F.


