- 2. The pool fence will be completed this Spring
- 3. The sign installation is complete except for the brick facia which will be completed by Spring The reason the sign was off was problems with the thaw & the anchors, it was fixed.
- 4. We have submitted our application for the Goose Egg collection for 2022. We will be notified when the collection dates will be.

OLD BUSINESS –

- 1. Smoke Alarms: The S.L. Fire dept. has battery operated smoke alarms for free, they will install one battery operated smoke detector. They do not have carbon monoxide alarms. Most units in Phase V have hard-wired smoke alarms that ring upstairs & down. The fire dept. does not do electrical work so cannot replace those They recommend you purchase a smoke detector/carbon monoxide combined alarm. This is required now if you're selling your unit.
- 2. Pancake Breakfast was a success. Thanks to the Aldingers & Giordans & ALL the volunteers who served up a great breakfast!
- **3.** Aubree's get together this month is on March 16th at 1:30. April's will be at the Kensington Grill in New Hudson the 20th at 4:00.

NEW BUSINESS

 Voting on whether to add four new colors for our front door is going well. You can continue to vote until April 30th, one vote per unit

Discussion:

62-1 How will we monitor the door colors if it passes? *Sue:* as people are walking, they can report colors that do not comply.

2. Jim R. has come up with a way to report monthly to the Board, updates on work orders & their progress. Katy & Mike volunteered to maintain Jim's reporting. This will be instead of going forward with a work program on line.

Discussion:

62-1 How do we put in work orders? Sue, All work orders should be reported to Clearview either by phone or email. Clearview will give the Board a monthly update on progress.

3.Pool fence is being considered to expand at each end of the pool be accommodate 2 more tables. This would have to be done before the fencing is put back up. Sue will check on pricing & feasibility.

- **4.** If you need any side jobs done around your unit you can contact "HIDRENT". **This is an APP** created by off duty firemen looking for extra work, such as cleaning gutters, hanging light fixtures, etc. Firemen do this in their off time to supplement their income.
- 5. Sue is working on getting the Fire Dept. to put on a fire safety meeting in the future.

59-5 When will wood fences in courtyards be painted/repaird? *This will be started this Spring*.108-1 My bus stop has a hole that needs to be checked.

108-1 Why has there been power outages by Raleigh Ct. It was out several times, one for 8 hrs. *Paul: this issue has been fixed*

62-1 Do we have anything in place to have speed bumps? This has been discussed in the past. The speed bumps in phase 1-4 have all been destroyed, except one, by the snow plows. Emergency vehicles request we do not put them in as it slows them down. Sue: we have raised the stop signs to help slow down drivers. In the past the Police have parked a car on Heritage to monitor everyone's speed. This does not seem to deter speeders plus the police cannot ticket them on private roads.

59-5 it's impossible to slow people down. *Yes, speed is a big problem to monitor.*

Paul: I recommend carbon monoxide / smoke alarms that are combined in one alarm. They are good for ten years, have lithium batteries that do not have to be replaced yearly. *Stacy suggested Paul get a price for these alarms including the installation*

Bill: I had a request from 139-3 to put patio blocks down to put salt containers on. It's killing the grass all around the container.

101-2 Notice when there are high winds lids blow off. Sue: we are in the process of attaching lids to containers

68-4 Questioned RV/LG Trucks being parked in parking spaces. *Sue: RV's are allowed to park in parking spots for 24 hour to load & unload. If trucks to not block any of the road they are allowed to park in their parking spaces*

MINUTES CLUBHOUSE MEETING MARCH 3, 2022

FINANCIAL: Our checkbook balance is \$28,601.81. Operating reserve is \$16,000.00 of that total.

REMINDERS:

Yoga classes in April will be on Monday at 11 am. No Thursday class after March. Discussion again evolved around the problem of our chairs and tables causing damage to our new floor as they are moved around for various purposes. The committee is still looking for budget conscious solutions to this issue. We may simply have to purchase covers for the bottoms of the chair legs on a regular basis, as they have a limited life span. The table situation continues to be researched for a solution that meets our criteria, while still being fiscally responsible.

A color sample of possible new door colors is available in the clubhouse. Please remember to vote, follow instructions and return your ballot to the red box in the clubhouse or mail it in.

Our science question of the month: WHAT DOES THE SPRING EQUINOX SIGNIFY?

After months of cold weather and hours of darkness, the sun will become more and more prominent through the day. For centuries, the vernal equinox has been a time of celebrating renewal and rebirth for many civilizations. But aside from marking the beginning of spring, what does the equinox signify?

During the course of Earth's rotation around the sun, there are four distinct positions that indicate we're heading into a new season. Scientifically, they're known as equinoxes (vernal in the spring and autumnal in the fall) and solstices (which happen in the summer and winter).

Like the seasons they represent, solstices are times of extremes. The summer solstice occurs when the Sun is at the highest point in the sky, and thus marks the longest day of sunlight of the year. The winter solstice is the opposite — when the Sun is at its lowest point and is accompanied by the shortest day of the year.

Directly between the two solstices are the equinoxes, which are considered times of equality. These are the two times of the year where day and night have equal lengths. On the equinox, the Sun passes over the equator at noon.

The spring equinox is the day when the sun crosses the celestial equator and days and nights share an equal length. From that point on, the hours of sunlight will be longer than the hours of darkness until the fall equinox. Then, at the autumnal equinox, the sun will cross the equator again, and the following days will become shorter than the nights.

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
