## BUSINESS FOR DISCUSSION AND/OR ACTION:

1. ORDINANCE: 18-0111 - PARKING RESTRICTIONS AND VIOLATIONS

Doc: We are constantly getting complaints about drivers parking in the Fire Lane. Most are coming from the Food Lion shopping center from Roses down to the Food Lion. It's not as bad at Lowes. Every time I go by the Food Lion there are shoppers parked in the Fire Lane. It is a public safety issue.
Council please check your agenda. Scott has included in the Ordinance 16 parking violations.
Scott: All violations are a risk to public safety and can be ticketed by any law enforcement personnel or any such person designated by the Town

Manager. The violation subjects the offender to a civil penalty of $\$ 25$ cash.
The civil penalty must be paid to the Town Clerk within 45 days. After 45 days if still unpaid, there is an additional $\$ 50$ civil penalty.
Peggy: Would we have the cars towed?
Scott: Only if there was a clear and present danger to public safety. Any fees associated with towing or storage are the responsibility of the owner.
Marilyn: When would this start?
Scott: If approved, December.
