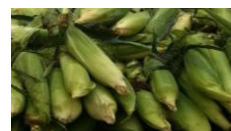

Stop the Deportations

An Interfaith Pilgrimage

In Support of Dreamers and All Immigrants

Sunday, November 12, 2017, 2:00-4:00PM

Goal: President Donald Trump has rescinded President Barack Obama's DACA executive order (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) that gave legal status to undocumented children brought to the United States by their parents. Congress has until March of 2018 to enact the Dream Act that would grant legal status to DACA recipients, *10,000 of whom live on Long Island*. This pilgrimage, led by Long Island faith leaders, will call upon all members of the Long Island Congressional delegation to support the Dream Act that legalizes DACA young people.

Potential Pilgrimage Routes: One of the routes below will be selected. Congregations along the routes will serve as "stations" for pilgrims to enter the pilgrimage. At the end of the pilgrimage, prayers, Scriptural readings, songs and speeches will call upon Congress to adopt the Dream Act.

1. Wantagh Memorial Congregational Church to the Massapequa office of Cong. Peter King (approximately three miles.)
2. Episcopal Church of the Messiah, Central Islip to the federal court house, Central Islip (approximately 2.4 miles)
3. Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal Church, Wyandanch to the federal post office, Wyandanch (approximately 1 mile)

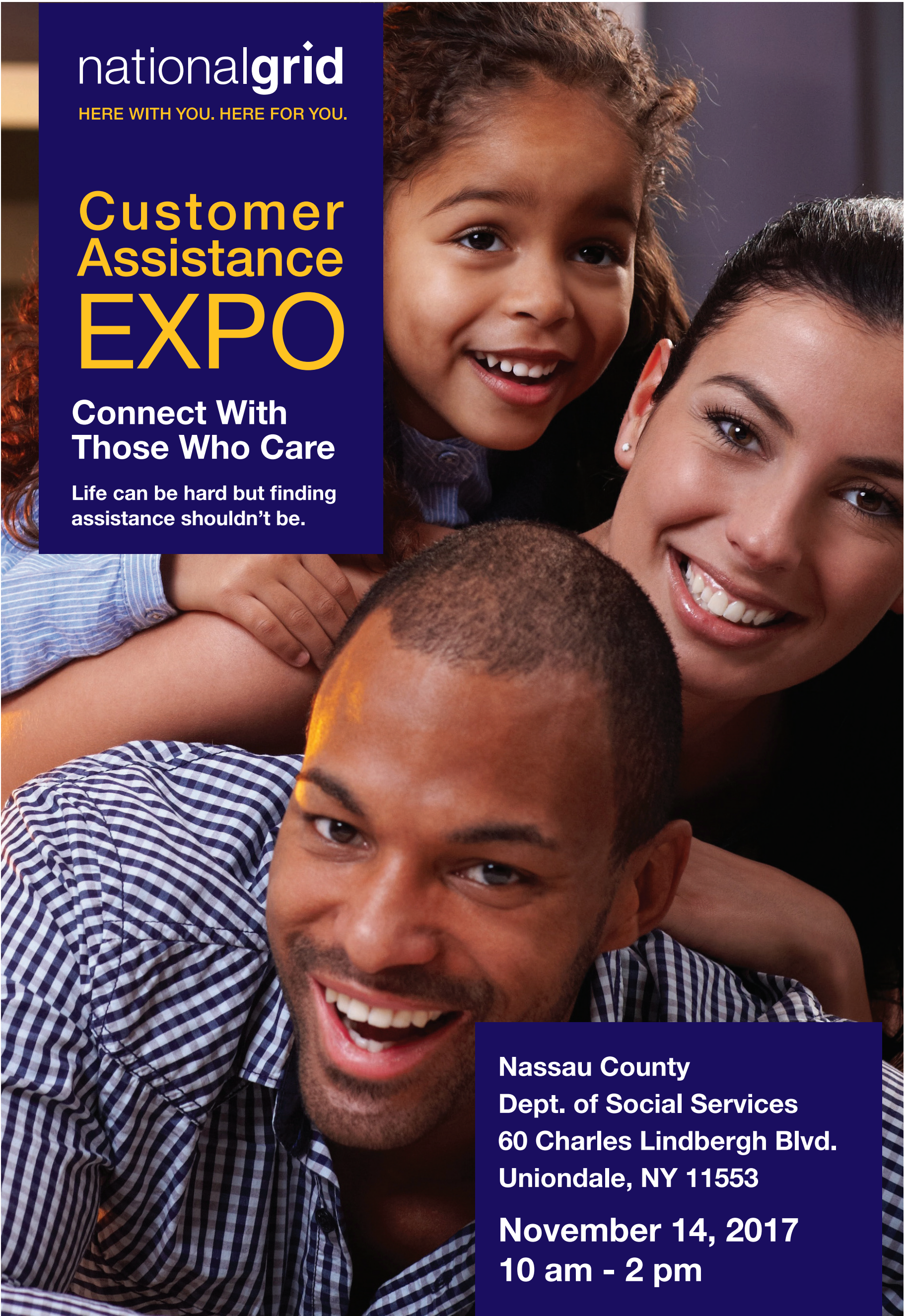

Cancer Prevention Symposium

According to World Health Organization Cancer is the second leading cause of death globally and accounted for 8.8 million deaths worldwide from cancer in 2015. Lung, prostate, colorectal, stomach and liver cancer are the most common types of cancer in men, while breast, colorectal, lung, cervix and stomach cancer are the most common among women. In the United States \$1.16 trillion was the estimated total annual economic cost of cancer in 2010. Cancer seems to affect at least one or more member of each family.

What is cancer?

Cancer is a generic term for a large group of diseases characterized by the growth of abnormal cells beyond their usual boundaries that can then invade adjoining parts of the body and/or spread to other organs. Other common terms used are malignant tumors and neoplasms. Cancer can affect almost any part of the body and has many anatomic and molecular subtypes that each requires specific management strategies.

Cancer Prevention

According to current evidence, between 30% and 50% of cancer deaths could be prevented by modifying or avoiding key risk factors.

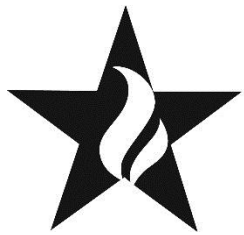
Domestic Violence Awareness Month

Join our team! SCOPE Education Services is a large non-profit provider of before and after school child care programs throughout Long Island, NY. We run these programs in schools in Nassau and Suffolk counties, although we are independent and not part of the school districts themselves. **We have immediate openings for Aide positions.** Hours for the before school positions are approximately 7:00 am-9:00 am. After school programs begin at school dismissal and operate until 6:30 pm. After school program aides are guaranteed to work a minimum of 3 hours each day. We have openings across Nassau and Suffolk Counties.

Responsibilities: Supervise children to maintain a safe environment and follow a daily schedule of age-appropriate activities; assist with set up and cleanup of daily activities and snacks; communicate with parents as required.

Educational Requirement: High School Diploma or its equivalent. Or – if no HS diploma, at least one year of experience working with children under age 13.

Many of our aide staff members are retirees, or other mature adults who enjoy working with elementary school age children, and like the rewards that come from being around youngsters, and contributing to their well-being and development. We pay \$10 per hour to start, with advancement possibilities available down the line.

All candidates must be able to pass a background clearance check, successfully complete a physical examination by a medical doctor, and be willing to complete certification in First Aid/CPR. SCOPE will help you with all the details.

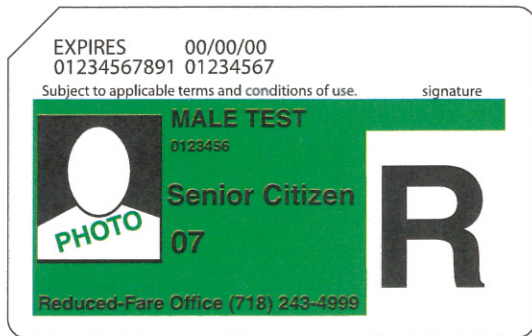

“Coming Together For Stronger Communities” Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE)

FREE TAX PREP FOR YOU

VITA: The VITA program offers FREE tax preparation to low-moderate income taxpayers. IRS-certified volunteers help eligible taxpayers in local communities with the electronic filing of their tax return(s).

TCE: The TCE program offers free tax help for everyone, with priority assistance given to taxpayers who are 60 years of age and older, specializing in questions about pensions and retirement issues unique to seniors.

SELF-HELP TAX PREP

In addition to traditional face-to-face tax preparation, the IRS offers a self-assistance service at many VITA/TCE locations. If individuals have a simple tax return and need a little help to prepare it or do not have access to a computer, they can visit one of the participating tax preparation sites and an IRS-certified volunteer will guide them through the process. You can also use www.MyFreeTaxes.com if you have a computer available; you can do it from the comfort of your own home if your adjusted gross income is below \$67,000.

WHERE DO I GO TO GET MY TAX RETURN PREPARED?

FIND A VITA SITE NEAR YOU

There are thousands of VITA sites located across the country. You may find a site near you year-round, but most sites are open between January and April. To find a site near you use the VITA Locator Tool on <http://irs.treasury.gov/freetaxprep/> or call **1-800-906-9887**.

FIND A TCE/AARP TAX-AIDE SITE NEAR YOU:

The AARP Foundation's Tax Aide Program operates most TCE sites. To locate the nearest TCE site or AARP Tax-Aide site use the AARP Site Locator Tool on www.aarp.org/applications/VMISLocator/searchTaxAideLocations.action or call

1-888-227-7669.

Note: Every taxpayer must use the correct Social Security Number (SSN) or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN). If you do not have a SSN or ITIN for you or your dependent(s), complete Form SS-5, Social Security Number Application. Then submit Form SS-5 to the nearest Social Security Administration Office. For individuals that need to get an ITIN they must attach Form W-7 for each Individual claimed with their completed return along with other required documents necessary for the Form W-7 to be validated.

1. Partners and volunteers will bring dollars and other valuable resources into their communities.
2. Volunteers will learn beneficial career building skills, business skills, and financial insights.
3. Partners and volunteers will provide taxpayers with free tax preparation, and financial guidance to help increase their income, build savings, and gaining and sustaining assets.
4. Volunteers will receive free IRS specialized tax preparation training.
5. Volunteers and taxpayers will become familiar with valuable deductions, allowable expenses, and tax credits.
6. Volunteers with PTINs can earn CE credits for instructing certain courses, tax preparation, and quality reviewing tax returns.
7. Student volunteers can earn community services hours and possible credits.

If applicable please bring the following:

- Proof of identification – Picture ID
- Social Security cards for you, your spouse, and dependents; Or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) assignment letter.
- Wage and earning statement (s) Form W-2, W-2G, 1099-R, 1099-Misc from all employers.
- Interest and dividend statements from banks (Forms 1099).
- Information statements such as Form 1098, mortgage & interest paid to lenders.

Acquire Lifelong Career Building Skills!

- Form 1098-T, tuition statement.
- ID Theft – IRS Notice CP01-A provides the Identity Protection PIN issued every year in December.
- A copy of last year's federal and state returns if available.
- Proof of bank account and routing numbers for direct deposit.
- Total paid for daycare provider. The provider's tax identification number, Social Security Number, or the provider's business Employer Identification Number.
- To file taxes electronically on a married-filing joint tax return, both spouses must be present to sign the required forms.

These volunteers are professionally trained, state certified advocates who listen to residents' needs and family concerns, then investigate and resolve issues on their behalf. **The tragic death of an eleventh nursing home resident on September 20th in Florida in the wake of Hurricane Irma is a reminder of the vulnerability of all long-term care residents.** (*Nursing home search warrants look wide for answers in death of 11 people, Miami Herald, Sept.28, 2017*)

Ombudsman volunteers assure that long term care residents are cared for appropriately by working with facility administrators and staff to improve the quality of residents' lives. Ombudsmen come from diverse backgrounds, some are retired and others are professionals who want to spend a few hours a week making a difference. The one trait they all have in common is the desire to help some of our most susceptible neighbors living in nursing homes, assisted living facilities, adult care, and family-type homes.

By becoming a certified volunteer any adult can help make a difference to the lives of our most vulnerable neighbors. The vital services Ombudsmen provide can help prevent tragedies and truly make a positive impact on our community!
