I began as a docent at Old Bethpage Village Restoration, a living history museum, and was asked eventually to become the Volunteer Coordinator for the Long Island Fair. This position expanded to my becoming the Volunteer Coordinator for all Nassau County run museums. Over the years some of the museums privatized, and today Old Bethpage Village Restoration, Garvies Point Museum and Preserve, Tackapausha Museum and Preserve and Falaise (a "gold coast" mansion) are my beat.
