CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

Republic Services will pick up your old Christmas trees with the regular trash service on Tuesdays at no additional charge. They ask that the trees be cut in half and the limbs tied down to make it easier and safer for the driver to place in the truck. These trees are taken to the land fill and not recycled.

Anyone wishing to recycle their old Christmas tree can take advantage of the City of Aurora's Christmas tree recycling program. Just drop off your tree at Olympic Park, (N.E. side of Chambers and Yale Ave). There is a designated area in the parking lot for trees. These trees are then ground up into mulch which is provided free of charge to Aurora residents. Andover Glen uses this free mulch every Spring to replenish mulched areas in Andover Glen Park to keep our water usage down.

COMMUNITY GARDEN

It is early January, snow is covering the ground, and the temperatures are in the single digits. Yes, it is time to start planning for your plot at the community garden. The garden is located just east of the tennis courts at Andover Glen Park. This year marks the seventh anniversary of our community garden. Due to demand from the residents of Andover Glen, it has expanded from the original 10 plots to 25 plots. The gardens provide an opportunity for residents to grow fruits, vegetable and flowers, develop friendships, and exchange gardening ideas with their neighbors. Many gardeners have such a bountiful harvest that they share their excess with friends, neighbors and community food banks. Additionally, the gardens save the community money by reducing the water usage at the park as all of the plots are on a timed drip system. Garden plots are available on a first come, first served basis, with plot renters retaining their right to a plot each year as long as the \$10 fee is paid. There are a few vacancies for this year's garden, so if you are interested, contact the garden coordinator, Norm Arlt at 303-766-7344 or any HOA board member. Spring will be here before you know it.
