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# Evaluation Report

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## Executive Summary

The *2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Virtue in an Age of Promiscuity* ladies retreat was held on March 1 and 2, 2013 and attended by nearly 300 women and girls. The retreat schedule included a Friday evening devotional followed by a dessert and coffee reception. The retreat is designed for ladies to discuss, appreciate, and internalize the character of *virtue* in their relationships and in their daily lives. To follow are the results of a program and logistics evaluation implemented with participants at the close of the retreat.

This report details the methodology used for the evaluation and the results of the evaluation. Married, unmarried, and teen/tween evaluation results are detailed along with summary comments from the forms regarding the overall impressions of the retreat and whether or not participants would attend again.

Finally, a recommendation for the future planning of the ladies day retreat in 2015 and beyond is included.

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## Background

The *Virtue in an Age of Promiscuity* ladies day retreat is designed to meet the needs of introducing, encouraging, validating, and strengthening the necessity of virtue in our everyday lives as a means to combat the images and propaganda we are subjected to daily. The primary topics addressed during the *Virtue in an Age of Promiscuity* ladies day retreat were:

- Submission
- Self-Respect
- Obedience
- Sex and Sexual Sin

The opening session (devotional plenary) featured Myra Fender of the Aberdeen Church of Christ in Aberdeen MD, and the closing devotional featured Crystal Reyes of the First State Church of Christ in Wilmington DE. Each workshop was conducted in tracks by marital status or age group – married women, single women 17 years and older, 12 to 16 year olds, and 5 to 11 year olds. There was one classroom for each track workshop, a strategy to ensure all track participants received the same message from each teacher/facilitator. Four facilitators (one for each topic) were assigned to each classroom. There were two workshops for each track.

Speakers and facilitators for the *2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Virtue in an Age of Promiscuity* ladies day retreat included knowledgeable, studied ladies who provided insight to the issues faced by ladies of various ages in this society. The speakers have experience that they shared as lessons learned for the ladies day participants. They also provided guidance for Bible-based best practices for ladies day participants to take and implement in their own lives. Speakers came from the following congregations:

- Aberdeen
- Capitol (Annapolis MD)
- Central (Baltimore)
- District Heights
- East Baltimore
- Suitland
- Overbrook Park

Participants in the ladies day retreat came from approximately 28 Churches of Christ and 4 denominational churches in Maryland, Delaware, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, New York, South Carolina, and Washington DC.

## Methodology

Although the 2012 evaluation included a recommendation to develop a survey format that will allow for the evaluation of self-efficacy, this was not accomplished in 2013. As in 2012, a survey using a Likert scale was utilized with each of the four tracks – married women, single women 17 years and older, and 12 to 16 year olds, and 5 to 11 year olds. All surveys asks each respondent to rate (poor, average, good, and excellent) each workshop, rate the retreat overall, indicate whether or not they would attend again or recommend attendance to a friend, and suggest topics for future retreats.

In response to the 2012 recommendations for delivering the same message to all participants and increasing interaction for participants to be fully engaged, the 2013 event instituted one teacher per track workshop instead of multiple sessions of each. The 2013 event also introduced the use of scenarios and role play as a learning tool.

Of the 111 married registrants, 36 (32.4%) responded to the survey. Of the 95 registered singles, 66 (69.4%) responded to the survey. Nineteen (42.2%) of the forty-five teen/tween participants responded to the survey.

All three surveys are in the appendix.

## Married Composite Results

Figures 1 and 2 represent the cumulative responses for both married workshops and the actual response numbers for each workshop follow. All 36 married respondents rated all 5 categories for each workshop. One respondent did not provide an overall rating for the fidelity workshop.

## Unmarried Composite Results

All unmarried (never married, divorced, widowed) participants were in one classroom for each workshop topic. Figures 3 and 4 represent the actual response numbers for each singles workshop. All 66 unmarried respondents rated all 5 categories for the workshops. Twenty-seven of the respondents self-identified as having never been married, twenty-two were divorced or separated, four were widowers, and twelve did not self-identify. One respondent checked both divorced or separated and widowed.

### Tween/Teen Composite Results

All 12 to 18 year old participants were in 1 classroom for each workshop topic. Figures 5 and 6 represent the actual response numbers for each tween/teen workshop. Of the 19 tween/teen respondents, 7 (36.8%) were 12-13 years old, 8 (42.1%) were 14-16 years old, and 1 (5.2%) was 17-18 years old. Three respondents did not check an age group.

## Summary Ratings

The overwhelming response to all workshops was highly favorable. Of all adult respondents, 106 out of 128 (83%) participants rated the workshops good or excellent. Figures 7 to 9 outline the breakdown of all workshop ratings for each track.

## Analysis

The overwhelming response to the overall event was highly favorable. Over 96% of respondents strongly agreed that the 2013 *Virtue in an Age of Promiscuity* retreat was organized, informative, inspirational, and spiritually uplifting (92% of tween/teen, 97% of single, and 100% of married participants). Roughly half of the respondents attended the 2012 *Virtue in an Age of Promiscuity* ladies retreat, and of the 116 who responded to

the question, “I would recommend the *Virtue in an Age of Promiscuity* ladies retreat to a friend,” 98.2% responded in the affirmative.

Overall, at least 91.2% of all respondents agreed that the workshops were at least good, with the majority of respondents giving them a rating of excellent or great.

The summary comments for each workshop indicate some areas of weakness in timing and comprehensiveness of topics, but offer insight into the favorable response to workshop content. The summary comments of the overall event offer insight into logistical concerns.

## Recommendations

After a review of the feedback of participants, consideration the logistics of the 2013 retreat, and examination of the implementation challenges and requirements, the committee finds the following:

- Registered participants should be able to select their own workshops.
- More time is needed to increase interaction and engage participants in practical application.
- With the use of practical application, an evaluation of self-efficacy in the form of a behavioral pre- and post-test evaluation to be administered immediately before the first workshop and immediately after the 2<sup>nd</sup> workshop.
- The program and logistics evaluation should be implemented as before to measure overall impact of event on participants.

The final recommendation for the *Virtue in an Age of Promiscuity* ladies retreat is to offer it long term, for as long as there is a need and interest among the Body. To that end are the following planning suggestions:

- Planning should commence for the next 3-4 retreats to secure best dates and rates and the most appropriate venues.
- Venue selection should be expanded to other parts of Maryland to take advantage of the best dates and rates.
- When possible, teachers/facilitators and speakers should be recruited on the recommendation of congregational leadership.
