



From the Minister's Mac:

Sunless-ness

Brian and I are back from vacation, having enjoyed what will be for us a once-in-a-lifetime event — a total solar eclipse. Having missed the one in 2017, we decided not to miss this one and drove to Arkansas to witness this solar wonder.

While my mother lives in Northwest Arkansas, she wasn't in the path of totality, so we all drove south to Russellville so we could experience the full eclipse. The newscasters had been talking it

up, especially about Russellville, which was holding a mass wedding ceremony for 150 people just before totality. They said it would be extremely crowded (it wasn't) and that it might rain (it didn't) and if it didn't rain there would be lots of clouds (there weren't).

It was a lovely 80° day and we sat under blue skies with folks from all over the country. We cheered when the eclipse started and we all broke out in spontaneous applause when totality was over. If you've ever seen a total eclipse, you know the feeling it brings, the sounds, the strange glow all around, the thick feeling of the cool air, and finally, the return of warmth and light.

We had been making comments all the way to Russellville, like "See you when the sun don't shine," and "Now we get to see the dark side of the moon," and "Sunless-ness is going to be so dark!" But you know what? It wasn't! It was darker, but not completely dark, and we marveled at how just a little ring of sunlight could still help us see. Just a thin ring of sunlight peeking out around the large and very dark orb of a moon still provided enough light to see one another, and the dogs sitting patiently beside their best friends, and the camera jockeys taking dozens of pictures that I hope turned out better than ours.

As I continue to reflect theologically about that spectacular astrological event, I think about the times in my life when I felt like I was dwelling in darkness, only to realize that the light of Christ was always there. It may have seemed obscured by clouds or the dark side of the moon (please forgive all the Pink Floyd references), but the light of Christ was there. Praise God! I look at the pictures I took and, because I had neither a strong enough solar filter nor a super telephoto lens, the dark moon is only a dot and the sun is shining just as brightly as ever (although you can see a few stars in the sky). What seemed like utter sunless-ness, was in fact a demonstration of the power of the Light.

Anyway, we made it home safely and look forward to many more Son-filled days as we roll from Spring into Summer.
