A Message From Your Editor

Lately I've been watching videos on "You-Tube" of old time gas engines. As I was watching these videos my mind went back to a time when we used one of these engines to cut wood for fence post and firewood. The old engine we had was one that my grandfather had bought back before my dad was born. And I remember very well that beginning from about mid to late September, the gathering of wood for the woodstoves rose higher on the list of work to be done. With any having to finish, and corn yet to cut, work was dictated by the weather. Even in the years after the livestock was sold, gathering the firewood continued to be on the list of work to do. And ironically, cutting firewood with the old buzz saw and gas engine was one of the things I enjoyed doing. Watching these videos, I find myself smiling as I vividly recall my dad going about checking, oiling, greasing, adding water and gas, preparing to start that old engine. It took a little time to prepare but then came the moment when dad would "start" that engine using one hand to choke and one hand to turn the flywheel. After a few turns, the first "pop" would signal it willingness to start. A few more turns and there was "pop", then another "pop", and then it would be running. With no work load on it, the simple governor kept it firing just enough to keep it running. Pop - pop - pop - then the "shew - shew - shew - pop shew – shew - "Putting a "log" on the table and pushing it through the saw, put a workload on it, "pop - pop - pop - pop - pop - " now add the sound of the saw "singing" as it cuts through the log. Once threw, repeat, over, and over, until your done. Many an afternoon was spent helping my father with the wood. A good many of those afternoons was a family "event". Surprisingly, even for many years after I had left home, I (and even my sister) would come and help "buzz wood". Somehow we have come to think of it as a fun thing to do. Of course we always made sure we were done in time for dinner. In the latter years, if weather permitted it, we would cook on the grill. I always seem to have a good appetite. And latter that night, I usually slept quite well.

It's been a few years now since the last time my father has "buzzed wood". And likely he will never do it again, which means that I may never "buzz wood" either. Yes, September was full of things, starting school, finishing the hay, starting the corn, the beginning of fall, but using that old "hit and miss" gas engine really stands out and makes me smile.

Important Information Re: Enhancements In an effort to provide clients with more food choices, the Food Bank has rolled out a new and improved Food Sense Menu beginning in September. The monthly package now contains 7 proteins in larger quantities along with 3 canned and 2 fresh fruit/vegetable items. The package cost is \$20.50 (a \$5 increase,) valued at approximately \$40. ### Vacation Bible School-2016, "The Great Bibleland Dig: Exploring the Life of Jesus

Twenty-six** children from our Childcare Program and four from our church family attended the 3-day program to explore the Life of Jesus. As they explored, along with Professor Goodheart and his Camel friend, Malachi and archeologists in training, Jill and Jubba, they learned that Jesus is: God's gift to us, our friend, our teacher, our helper and our savior. A skit each morning helped to bring the daily theme to life as the kids explored the world in Jesus' time – more than 2,000 years ago. The program featured lively music, awesome crafts, exciting & interactive Bible stories, creative snacks, fun games and an Archeological Dig site where the crews uncovered clues about Jesus' life on earth and how they relate to our lives today. organization that provides food and lodging for families who travel to Syracuse in search of medical help for their sick children. The **Ronald McDonald House Charities of Central New York**. sponsored a

"Christmas in July" event to help fill their shelves with essential items for the families. During the week, the children brought in their donations. Together we filled two large gift boxes! The items were donated to the Ronald McDonald House on July 27th. The children learned how great it feels to help make life a little happier for the families of sick children.

During our final session together, the children had an opportunity to put the final touches on our VBS Banner and create a collage of photos to display for all to see. We ended our time together with a special Celebration/Recognition Ceremony, where each of the three crews performed a song they learned for the group and our cast of characters provided a recap of the lessons learned. Each child received a VBS Certificate and photo, was held in the sanctuary for families and friends to attend. A "Tell the Good News Picnic," was held under the big tent in the church yard. It was a beautiful day to celebrate!!
