A Simple Guide for Behavior

I've been thinking about how we view "church people". You know, the ones who walk through the church doors to be in the congregation. We tend to hold them to a higher

standard, because they are "Christians". We expect more from them and we might just judge them a little more harshly.

The reality is: they are the same people as are walking on the streets. Walking through a door doesn't make them any better of a person than anyone else.

What might make them better?


Did you ever stop to think it's *ourselves* that we should hold to that higher standard?

Matthew 7 ¹⁻⁵ "Don't pick on people, jump on their failures, criticize their faults—unless, of course, you want the same treatment. That critical spirit has a way of boomeranging. It's easy to see a smudge on your neighbor's face and be oblivious to the ugly sneer on your own. Do you have the nerve to say, 'Let me wash your face for you,' when your own face is distorted by contempt? It's this whole traveling road-show mentality all over again, playing a holier-than-thou part instead of just living your part. Wipe that ugly sneer off your own face, and you might be fit to offer a washcloth to your neighbor.




