

- "Go and teach" vs. "Go and teach to obey"
- Concept of discipleship in the ancient world (Face to Face)
 - More than just reading the teachings, it meant spending time with a person who personified the teachings.
- Jesus said "I am with you always..." and then He leaves. Yet, He is uniquely present in the Body of Christ. (Matt 18:20)
- Paul and the Corinthians (1 Cor 4:14-17)
 - \circ Paul's special responsibility and special relationship (1 Cor 4:15)
 - o Paul Modeled Christ for others to Follow (1 Cor 4:16) (1 Cor 11:1, Heb 13:7)
 - o Paul modeled Jesus to Corinthians through Timothy (1 Cor 4:17)
- There is no such thing as isolated discipleship apart from the body of Christ
 - o To neglect the body is to harm your discipleship and that of others
- II. Two Things to Never Stop Doing
- No matter where you are in your spiritual journey...Never stop LEARNING. (Prov 18:15, Phil 4:9)
 - o Personal study (homework), mentor study (tutor), group study (class).
 - Who is Your Spiritual Mentor? Who would you like it to be?
- No matter where you are in your spiritual journey...Never stop TEACHING. (2 Tim 2:2)

Possible Questions to Ask With Spiritual Mentor:

- Where have you seen God at work in your life or in the lives of those around you?
- Where are you seeing opportunities to partner with God in the work he's already doing?
- What are you sensing God has been saying to you (through Scripture, prayer, discussion, nature, thoughts, circumstances)?
- How are your disciplines (reading Scripture, praying, journaling, eating, sleeping, exercise...)?
- What are some of the things you are most grateful for?
- What are the areas of your life that you are struggling with or getting in the way of you following Jesus?
- How are your relationships? Is there anyone you need to pursue reconciling with?
- Based on what we have been talking about, what is one thing you'd like to try and put into practice or work on doing differently?
