The results of the evening's activities enabled the MDA to be the recipient of well over \$1,000.00.

LYNN WOOLF, DDA secretary, was chairperson for the first-time-ever major fund raising event.

DART GAMES

Sometime ago we tried to enlighten Dayton darters of dart games other than Cricket and Ol. Killer was mentioned in an earlier issue of the NEWSLETTER. Reports have come to your editor that Killer has been played recently and, if I am not mistaken, it was at the Cubbyhole.

more detailed description. So, here ya go-Each participant lists his name on the
scoreboard, then a line is drawn under the
last name. Each player then throws three
darts in the order shown on the scoreboard

Several responses have been made for a

last name. Each player then throws three darts in the order shown on the scoreboard except that if the dart scores lower (or the same) as the previous dart, he is out and his name crossed through. A typical Killer result would look something like this:

Joe - 25, Bob - 30, Ralph - 30 (out), Jim - 56, Cal - 40 (out), Harry - 60; Joe - 66, Bob - 45 (out), Jim - 70, Harry - 60 (out); Joe - 67 (out); Jim is the winner.

Joe 25 66 67 out Bob 30 45 out

Ralph 30 out

Jim 56 70 winner

Cal 40 out

Harry 60 60 out

In another variation, the darter who fails to shoot a higher score is out as in the previous example.

In this version, the score of the eliminated darter is used as the score to beat by the following darter. This allows for a more exciting game. Example:

Joe - 25, Bob - 30, Ralph - 30 (out), Jim - 56, Cal - 40 (out), Harry - 30 (out); Joe - 66, Bob 17 (out), Jim - 26; Joe - 67, Jim - 70; Joe - 45 (out); Jim is the winner.
