How Rehearsals Work

- Don't panic—you won't be called to every rehearsal, especially in the beginning. The
 director will create a schedule that makes the most sense based on your role and
 conflicts.
- Closer to showtime, you can expect more focused rehearsals where everyone is called.

We're not looking for perfection; we're building a story together. Be ready to show up, communicate, and enjoy the process. After all, theatre is all about creating something magical as a team!

A Note About Communication

We totally understand that life happens! The key to a smooth process is communication. If you know about conflicts, big or small, please be upfront and list them when you audition. This helps us plan the schedule in a way that works for everyone.

If something unexpected comes up during rehearsals, let us know as soon as possible. We'll do our best to accommodate, but keep in mind that consistency is crucial as we get closer to opening night.

What You Need to Know

- **No Participation Fees:** At OPPA!, we believe that community theatre should be accessible to everyone. There are no fees required to participate in *Titanic the Musical*.
- Scripts and Scores: Provided free of charge—no deposit required. These are yours to
 use throughout the production. Please take care of them and return them in good
 condition at the end of the run.
- **Costumes:** Costumes will be provided for all cast members. Occasionally, you may be asked to supply your own shoes, pants, or other basic items, but we'll work with you to ensure everyone is equipped.

Roles and Casting

The Audition Process

- What to Prepare: Bring a 30-second song in the style of the show. Use your phone or device for accompaniment (no live accompanist provided). This is your chance to show off your unique style and enthusiasm.
- **Video Auditions:** If you can't attend in person, no problem! Video auditions are welcome—just make sure to submit them by the specified deadline.
- Callbacks: If needed, callbacks will take place on January 4, 2025, at 10 am.

Fair and Respectful Auditions

- Limited Time Commitment: No one will be asked to stay at callbacks longer than 3 hours total.
- Safety First: You won't be asked to perform any intimate scenes or acts of violence (e.g., gun fights, sword fights) during callbacks.
