
Mexican & Sacramento's County Southern Land Grants




Mark Davidson will present an entertaining and informative look at the history of Sacramento's county area land grants and will include a number of displays he created. Our local land grants, starting in 1841, were the first real estate transactions affecting this region. His interests are in the back stories of the fascinating people and events that shaped our early Sacramento heritage, things that are not often found in history books.


Mark graduated from CSUS and lives in Fair Oaks. His seven grandchildren are seventh generation Sacramentans (via his wife Karens Great, Great Grandfather, Louis Fredericks, who arrived here in 1851), eventually leading to a family plot in the Rose Garden of the old City Cemetery located at 10th and Y Streets (now Broadway).

His American family tree dates back to the early settlers of Jamestown, Virginia in 1610, where a Mrs. Rebecca Rolfe was his ancestors (Col. John Flood, of the House of Burgesses) neighbor and also his same age. Her famous father, Chief 'Powhatan", gave her the name Mat-o-aka" at birth (but then later nicknamed her..."Pocahontas").
