

New Norwegian Units




These are Norwegian recon units that also function as forward observers. These units have all the capabilities of a forward observer and may be assigned a dedicated artillery or mortar battery.



The Leopard 2A5 is an up-armored Leopard 2A4 but lacking the 55 calibre gun of the Leopard 2A6 and Leopard 2E. The unit is equipped with CITV.



The BV206 is essentially the same vehicle as the French VHM. This vehicle suffers no penalty when crossing a steep hexside; it is designed for mountain operation in wet or snowy conditions. The unit is fully amphibious and may disregard marsh/swamp terrain movement modifiers.



The Norwegian light scout units are mounted on ATVs or Snowmobiles depending upon weather conditions. These units may ignore steep slope and swamp/marsh terrain movement modifiers. They are not amphibious.



The XA185 is the Norwegian version of a Finnish wheeled 6X6 APC. It is armed with a .50 cal M2 machine gun.



The CV90 entered production in Sweden in 1993. The Norwegians got around to procuring it in 1999. The Norwegian version, CV9030, is armed with the Bushmaster II 30mm cannon instead of the 40mm on Swedish vehicles.
