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## **NOTICE OF COMMENCEMENT**

### **BACKGROUND**

The Corporation of the Municipality of Neebing, the owner and operator of the East Oliver Lake (Scoble) Landfill, has commenced an Environmental Screening Process in accordance with the Waste Management Projects Regulation (Ontario Regulation 101/07) of the *Environmental Assessment Act* in order to amend the current Environmental Compliance Approval (ECA) for the landfill. The landfill is located on East Oliver Lake Road (see Key Map) and has been in operation since 1984. The landfill presently accepts household waste, electronics, compost, metals, brush, tires and recyclables.

### **PROPOSED UNDERTAKING**

The present ECA provides for a 0.28 hectare landfilling area, which has been exceeded. The Municipality is proposing to amend the current ECA to increase the landfilling area at the site to 1.62 hectares, which would add approximately 80,000 m<sup>3</sup> of capacity to the site and extend the landfill life by an estimated 32 years. The work will also include the establishment of a downgradient contaminant attenuation zone.



### **PROCESS AND CONSULTATION**

The project is subject to the Ministry of Environment Conservation and Parks Screening Process for Waste Management Projects in accordance with Ontario Regulation 101/07 under the Environmental Assessment Act and the Guide to Environmental Assessment Requirements for Waste Management Projects. The results will be documented in an Environmental Screening Report, which will be released for public and agency review.

### **CONSULTATION AND PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE**

Members of the public, Indigenous communities, agencies or other interested persons are encouraged to participate in the Environmental Screening Process and the planned consultation process.
