Safety, not Speed. (We're Greyhawk, not Daytona!)

You've probably seen these new signs near the entrances of the community (off of Eureka and Douglas).... The HOA Board is exploring all options to try to make sure traffic coming through the community drives slowly and observes all stop signs. Unfortunately, we are considered an alternate route for emergency vehicles (such as fire trucks), so we cannot add "hard" deterrents such as speed bumps or gates. Tips and Neighborhood Notes:

As we're heading toward the heat of summer, please consider the following:

- Lawn and garden tips: (1) Consider watering your lawn twice per day to keep it growing before the sun rises, and after it sets (not during the heat of the day). Obviously, if water usage restrictions are put in place, please observe them; (2) Later in summer, if you start seeing random tall sprigs of a "V-shaped" grass growing, it's probably a weed known as nutsedge; there are herbicides available which you can spray directly on the plants to kill them, which is recommended rather than pulling them; and (3) If you're looking to grow stuff outside, we are in USDA zone 9b. Check online to learn what grows best here!
- <u>Keep our sidewalks safe</u> (and beautiful)! If you have a drain that empties onto a sidewalk, it's your responsibility to make sure that it doesn't spread "muck" on the sidewalk, which creates a safety hazard (and is unsightly). Please make sure your drains are as clear as possible by removing the cover and cleaning out any dirt or sludge. (And, if accessible, shooting water through the pipes with a hose to clear them out.)
- As daylight hours continue to lengthen, please check your outdoor lights to ensure they're working correctly, and adjust the timing for when they turn on and off.
