THE LOVE OF GOD FOR HUMANITY

Humanity has an intimate relationship with God from the very beginning for we were created in Gods' image. Not only that, we have an intimate relationship with each other, for the partner of the first human was created out of the



first. These are the lessons that this creation myth tries to impart. We are made in the image of God and created to be in relationship with each other. "It is not good for the man to be alone" any more than it was good for

God to be alone (Genesis 2:18). Though God's Son had not yet come into our world and Gods' spirit had not yet come down upon us, God has always been in this Trinitarian relationship. The flow of love from one person to another is a necessary constituent of conscious life from the start.

The author of Hebrews notes that in order to accomplish His mission Jesus needed to share in our humanity. In doing so, he became Emmanuel, "God with us." We are brothers and sisters with Jesus, for "He who consecrates and those who are being consecrated all have one origin" (Hebrews 2:11). We have an intimate connection not just with one another, but with God.



What does it mean to "accept the kingdom of God like a



child" (Mark 10:15)? Does it mean that we should be immature in our faith, ignorant in our knowledge, and blind in our obedience? Or does it mean we must acknowledge that there are some things beyond human understanding? As intimate as our connection to God may be, we are still as dependent as a child is to her/his parents, so we are

called to be as trusting as a child.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

In what ways are relationships in my life similar to the love of God for humanity? Do some relationships fail to mirror that love God has for us? Can I look at others in my life as God does?

OCTOBER 7TH—OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

Pope Saint Pius V established this feast in 1573. The purpose was to thank

God for the victory of Christians over the Turks at Lepanto—a victory attributed to the praying of the rosary. Clement XI extended the feast to the universal church in 1716.

The development of the rosary has a long history. First, a practice developed of praying 150 Our Fathers in imitation of the 150 Psalms. Then there was a parallel practice of praying 150 Hail Marys. Soon a mystery of Jesus' life was attached to

each Hail Mary. Though Mary's giving the rosary to Saint Dominic is recognized as unhistorical, the development of this prayer form owes much to the followers of Saint Dominic. One of them, Alan de la Roche, was known as the "apostle of the rosary." He founded the first Confraternity of the Rosary in the fifteenth century. In the sixteenth century the rosary was developed to include fifteen mysteries (joyful, sorrowful and glorious). In 2002, Pope John Paul II added the Mysteries of Light to this devotion.
