Scholarships available to SVBA Churches The James Arvel Hendrix Leadership Fund

The purpose of the James Arvel Hendrix Memorial Leadership Fund is to assist local congregations of the Steel Valley Baptist Association in discovering and developing leaders who will advance Christ's kingdom in Northeast Ohio and beyond. Requests for scholarships will be limited to \$1,000 per church congregation and \$500 per individual within the congregation receiving the leadership training. The scholarships will be based on written request from member church leadership stating the purpose and projected expense of the leadership development project. Approved expenses are available to be paid in advance of the expense being incurred or as a reimbursement of expenses incurred by the scholarship recipient. Specific scholarship requests will be evaluated for approval by the Administrative Team of the SVBA. Submission of request must be made before Sept 30, 2019.

The desire is for as many leaders in our association to receive quality training

shepherd. Then He said to His disciples, "The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore, pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest."



Most often when this passage is referenced, the primary take away is that there is a labor shortage in the mission field that must be remedied by having more hands in the work. But as I have come to understand the context of this passage, Iesus was not so much concerned with "hands" in the work; He was focused upon "hearts" in the work. We notice that His challenge to "pray the Lord of the harvest" was in the context of His own compassion for the weary and scattered multitudes. The issue was not a "labor deficit" the issue was "A LOVE DEFICIT". Christ challenged His disciples to pray that the Father would send (compel, force) laborers who shared His compassion for lost and hurting people. I have found that when people are moved by compassion you don't have to motivate them, you simply must direct their motion.

Steel Valley Membership

We currently have 35 churches on the roll as member churches of the Steel Valley Baptist Association, however, only about one half of these churches participate at the level of giving and supporting meetings/events. My assignment is to service all the churches currently on our roll and it is my commitment to do so, regardless of their level of involvement as long as they are on the roll. However, my pastoral, denominational and parachurch experience informs that the wisest use of time and resource is to give priority attention to those who are "on mission" with us. One of my early mentors instructed me this way, he said, "In order to avoid ulcers in the ministry focus on those who will, rather than on those who won't"!!!

Strategy

Since church planting is without a doubt the most effective means of fulfilling the Great Commission in evangelism and discipleship, we will challenge churches in this association to plant new congregations. We recognize, however, that a church must be healthy to plant efficiently, effectively and "impactfully". Unfortunately, few of our churches are healthy enough to incubate healthy new congregations. It is therefore my intention to develop a KINGDOM CO-HORT of churches in this association to commit to a 3-year church health process that will result in healthy church planting.

Kingdom Cohort

We want to take the next 3 years to work directly with Kingdom Cohort Congregations during which time the pastor and at least 2 church leaders will commit to:

- Conduct a thorough (and perhaps painful) church health assessment of their congregation
- Fully commit to take part in quarterly church health training sessions
- Implement a church healthiness process for 3 years

• Prepare during this process to plant at least 1 new congregation either locally or nationally after 3 years.

I am not in pursuit of an immediate response to this church planting challenge. We will ask congregations convinced to join this process to make this commitment at the Spring Quarterly Business Meeting on April 8, 2019. In preparation for this possible commitment we are encouraging each

church in the association to begin the *Experiencing God* Course (Blackaby and King) in January of 2019.

Though many of our churches have taken this impactful course already, we are challenging you to the journey of

Experiencing God... Again.

On Mission

Brothers and Sisters ... we must move from a "club mentality" in our congregations to a mission mentality. Remember that when Jesus launched His 3-and-a-half-year ministry in the synagogue of his hometown Nazareth, He didn't try to come up with a new contemporary theme for a mission statement. He read from Isaiah 61 which says:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me,
Because He has anointed Me
To preach the gospel to the poor;
He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted,
To proclaim liberty to the captives
And recovery of sight to the blind,
To set at liberty those who are oppressed;
To proclaim the acceptable year of the
Lord.

As Bob Pierce, founder of World Vision, put it, "Let [our] hearts be broken by the things that break the heart of God."
