Led by Jermar Jefferson's (pictured) 226 rushing yards, Oregon St upset rival Oregon last Friday night in a thriller 41-38. The Beavers were 13-point underdogs and were 4/1 on the money line.

Misleading Finals

Stanford (-1.5) beat Cal 24-23. However, Cal had 20-16 first down and 392-300 yard edges including 241-95 on the ground. Stanford was +2 in TO's. Cal scored a TD with :58 left but missed the extra point!

Texas A&M (-15.5) beat LSU 20-7. However, the yards were even at 267-267 but A&M did have a 162-36 rushing yard edge. The Aggies were +3 in TO's including a 15-yard interception return TD.

Bad Beats

Eastern Michigan (+6.5) backers got a bad beat as EMU led 23-14 mid-4Q vs Central Michigan. EMU had 3 straight TO's and CMU scored 17 points in the final 5 minutes to cover the spread by 1.5-points.

Oklahoma St (-12) backers saw Texas Tech score 2 TD's in the final 4 minutes to get the back-door cover. However, that wasn't the worst of it. Oklahoma St up 6 with 90 seconds had a RB break free in the open field. He would've easily scored a TD but decided to take a knee inside the 5-yard line so OSU could run out the clock.

Injuries/COVID Cases

We had 18 games postponed or cancelled last week including Colorado St at Air Force, Washington at Washington St, San Diego St at Fresno St, Southern Miss at UAB, Minnesota at Wisconsin, WKU at Charlotte, Cincinnati at Temple, Virginia at Florida St, Louisiana Tech at FIU, Oklahoma at West Virginia, Miami, FL at Wake Forest, Tulsa at Houston, San Jose St at Boise St, Colorado at USC, Ohio St at Illinois, FAU at Middle Tennessee, Tennessee at Vanderbilt and UTEP at Rice.

This week's **Southern Miss/UTEP** game was cancelled due to positive cases at UTEP. This week's **Washington St/USC** game, originally scheduled for Friday night was moved to Sunday.

This week's **Florida St/Duke** game was cancelled and Duke will host Miami, FL instead.

This week's **Northwestern/Minnesota** game was cancelled due to COVID issues at Minnesota.

Arizona QB Grant Gunnell left last week's game with a shoulder injury. He is questionable for this week's game vs Colorado.

Boston College QB Phil Jurkovec left last week's game with a knee injury. He is questionable for this week's game at Virginia.

Central Michigan QB Daniel Richardson is out indefinitely. Ty Brock will get the start this week vs Ball St.

Georgia Southern QB Shai Werts left last week's game with a shoulder injury. He is questionable for this week's game vs Florida Atlantic.

Indiana QB Michael Penix is out for the season with a torn ACL. Jack Tuttle will get the start at Wisconsin this week.

New Mexico QB's Trae Hall (ribs) and Tevaka Tuoti (concussion) are both questionable for this week's game vs Wyoming.

Ohio QB Kurtis Rourke (Upper Body) is ? for this week's game vs Buffalo.

Oregon St QB Tristan Gebbia (Hamstring) is ? for this week's game at Utah.

San Diego St QB Lucas Johnson (Hamstring) is ? vs Colorado St.

Tulsa QB Zach Smith (knee) has been upgraded to probable vs Navy.

UCLA QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson is ? for this week's game vs Arizona.

UCLA RB Demetric Felton was practicing on Tuesday after getting banged up in the Arizona game last Saturday.

Washington St QB Jayden de Laura is expected to play Sunday vs USC.

Thursday, December 3rd

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

NORTH TEXAS 34 Louisiana Tech 33. It seems like we write about Louisiana Tech every week but the Bulldogs haven't played since Halloween. Please note that they've had two of their top players opt out in the last 10 days including WR Adrian Hardy (leading receiver) and RB Justin Henderson (2nd leading rusher). Meanwhile, North Texas has played the last couple of weeks and will want to atone for getting run over by UTSA last week. Big money came in on North Texas Wednesday morning flipping them to favorite.

Air Force 30 UTAH ST 20. Last week our biggest power ratings difference was Utah St and they pulled the outright upset over New Mexico on Thanksgiving. QB Andrew Peasley was 14 of 21 for 239 yards and 3 TD's while also running for 118 yards and a TD in his first start and gives the Aggies a much-needed upgrade at the position. Meanwhile, Air Force beat that same New Mexico team 28-0 in their last game. However, their game was cancelled last Thursday vs Colorado St. Slight lean on the home team as we feel they continue to be disrespected in the market.

Friday, December 4th

APPALACHIAN ST 28 UL-Lafayette 25. One of the better matchups in the Group of 5. App St is a perfect 8-0 vs ULL winning those games by an average of 19 ppg. The Mountaineers got a rare cover last week (just 2-7 ATS on the season) in a blowout win over Troy. App St is +15 ppg and +137 ypg on the season. Meanwhile ULL also comes in off a blowout win over rival ULM 70-20! ULL is +13 ppg and +90 ypg on the season. Too close to call.

Boise St 43 UNLV 16. The Rebels have been a train wreck under first-year coach Marcus Arroyo. At 0-5 SU and 0-4-1 ATS, they've been outscored by 21 ppg and outgained by 169 ypg. Meanwhile, Boise has been dealing with COVID issues and saw their game vs San Jose St cancelled last week. Usually, we'd call for a hidden homefield as Boise usually has more fans than UNLV in the stands when they travel to Vegas. However, with no fans allowed, that becomes a moot point here. We don't see much value.

Saturday, December 5th

NC STATE 33 Georgia Tech 28. The Yellow Jackets came off their extended bye strong with a 23-point win over Duke last week. They owned the line of scrimmage with a 377-68 rushing yard edge. Meanwhile NC State is 7-3 this season but haven't been overly impressive the last couple of weeks with non-covers vs Liberty and Syracuse. They had to hang on in the final seconds in both. The Wolf Pack are -28 ypg on the season but are 4-1 in one possession games. The only hang-up we see was GT true frosh RB Jahmyre Gibbs getting banged up last week. We lean GT and the OVER.

GEORGIA 44 Vanderbilt 9. Obviously, Vanderbilt has made national news the last few days. First, with kicker Sarah Fuller becoming the first woman to play in a Power 5 game. Then after an embarrassing 41-0 loss to Missouri, they appropriately fired head coach Derek Mason. At 0-8, what is there to play for? Meanwhile, UGA's offense has found new life with JT Daniels under center. However, it was the ground game (332 yards) that led the way in the blowout of South Carolina last week. Don't see much value here.

Clemson 45 VIRGINIA TECH 20. Clemson looked motivated last week vs Pitt. The Tigers raced out to a 31-0 first quarter lead and crushed the Panthers 52-17 as we easily cashed the OVER on these pages. Despite not playing in 5 weeks, QB Trevor Lawrence threw for 403 yards. Meanwhile, VT is off a bye but have lost 3 straight games all as a favorite. That same Pitt team that Clemson crushed last week, beat VT 47-14 two weeks ago. Program budgets are tight this year, but you have to wonder if Justin Fuente is coaching for his job as his tenure has left a lot to be desired. Clemson is on 25-1 SU (+33 ppg) and 20-6 ATS (+7 ppg) vs ACC foes. The one loss (ND) and two recent non-covers came when Lawrence was out. They roll here.

VIRGINIA 30 Boston College 26. BC head coach Jeff Hafley has done a really nice job in his first season. The Eagles clinched a winning regular season last week with a win over Louisville (we had them on these pages). BC QB Phil Jurkovec threw for 203 yards but got hurt and Dennis Grossel came in and threw 2 TD passes. As of press time, Jurkovec is questionable but reading the tea leaves, we think he will play. Meanwhile, UVA's game at Florida St was cancelled last minute. Statistically speaking, UVA is -20 ypg, BC is -31 so the teams are pretty close. We lean BC and the OVER.

KENTUCKY 30 South Carolina 20. Both teams are playing at far less than full strength and both were out-classed last week by the two best teams in the East division. The Gamecocks are not only banged up but have seen several players opt out after they fired head coach Will Muschamp a couple of weeks ago. They were run over by Georgia last week and you have to wonder if they are just playing out the season at this point. Meanwhile, UK played hard vs UF early and led 10-7 late 2Q before UF controlled matters. The Wildcats deserve to be favored here but we're not keen on laying double-digits. Our power ratings say SC is the play here.

Florida St at Duke was cancelled due to COVID issues at FSU.

COASTAL CAROLINA 33 Liberty 24. ESPN's *College GameDay* will be here and it is deserved. We have a really good Group of match-up with a pair of teams that are not only a combined 18-1 straight up but also 15-3-1 ATS. Liberty comes in with 7 straight covers and are led by QB Malik Willis who has a 20-to-4 TD-to-INT ratio and has also ran for 807 yards and 10 TD's. Despite playing 3 ACC teams, Liberty is +19 ppg and +182 ypg on the year. Meanwhile, Coastal is also led by their QB Grayson McCall who has a 20-to-1 TD-to-INT ratio. The Chanticleers are +22 ppg and +126 ypg on the season and are on a 6-0-1 ATS run. As we're typing this up on Tuesday evening, Coastal Carolina took some major money in the market place driving the number up from -7 to -10.5. A Tuesday move like that indicates sharper money is on them and it appears Liberty is dealing with COVID issues that could include QB Malik Willis. We're passing until the situation clears.

MICHIGAN 33 Maryland 26. As of Tuesday, Michigan's in-person football activities have been paused due to COVID so they haven't physically practiced this week. Last week, the Wolverines were controlled at home by an 0-5 Penn St team and head coach Jim Harbaugh's seat continues to warm. Meanwhile, we believe Maryland is overrated in the market and one of our stronger power ratings plays last week was to fade them vs Indiana and the Terps fell short in a 27-11 loss. If the Wolverines were actually practicing, we'd actually lean with them here. For now, we're passing.

OHIO ST 42 Michigan St 15. The Buckeyes saw last week's game at Illinois cancelled due to COVID issues and they will be without head coach Ryan Day here. It is unknown who and how many of their players will be out and note they can't afford to lose another game if they are to make the Big Ten Championship game. There won't be a Big Ten Champ game for Michigan St but they have already pulled two big upsets this year including last week taking down previously unbeaten Northwestern as 13.5-point underdogs. However, we think they will be up against it here and note they were handled by Iowa and Indiana prior by a combined 73-7. Buckeyes may be looking for style points and the only thing preventing us from playing them as a star-rated pick is the COVID unknowns for them.

PURDUE 31 Nebraska 30. A couple years ago both fan bases thought they had their guy at head coach but both Nebraska's Scott Frost and Purdue's Jeff Brohm have disappointed. Last week the Boilers disappointed us on these pages as we felt good at halftime when they led 23-13 but somehow couldn't adjust to Rutgers' QB run game in the second half which turned into an outright upset loss to Rutgers. Meanwhile, Nebraska got a cover vs Iowa last week, but in Year 3 under Frost, close losses aren't going to cut it. It was QB Adrian Martinez who got plenty of the reps after Luke McCaffrey played the majority of the Illinois loss the week before. We'd be interested in Nebraska at +3.

Penn St 35 RUTGERS 24. Last week Penn St finally got their first win of the season and we certainly don't think they had given up. Statistically speaking, they should have a few more wins as they are +70 ypg but are -8 in TO's. Meanwhile, Rutgers is one of the most improved teams in the entire country as we would currently favor them by 15.5 over what they were at the end of last season. Last week they made strong halftime adjustments and rallied from a 10-point deficit to beat Purdue. They could easily be 4-2, if not for last-second losses to Illinois and Michigan. As much as we think Penn St is under-valued, we don't see much value fading Rutgers this week. Lean OVER.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN 23 Florida Atlantic 21. After two straight close losses, Georgia Southern fired their offensive coordinator after the Georgia St game this weekend. Call us a little surprised considering the offense is banged up missing their top two RB's and QB Shai Werts is less than 100%. On the other side, FAU's defense under new coordinator Jim Leavitt has thrived so far this season allowing just 11 ppg and 294 ypg. The FAU offense has left a lot to be desired but frosh QB Javion Posey has been a revelation in the QB run game the last few weeks. We don't see much value here.

AKRON 30 Bowling Green 27. Outside of UMass, these are the two worst teams in college football. Akron has lost 21 straight games by an average of 25 ppg. They are just 4-17 ATS in those 21 games failing to cover by 9 ppg but yet find themselves favored here over a BG team that is in the midst of its worst stretch in the history of the school. This year's BG is probably their worst team ever as the Falcons are -35 ppg and -190 ypg (Akron is -31 ppg and -189 ypg). We don't see much value.

1★ Ball St 31 CENTRAL MICHIGAN 29. Central Michigan's starting QB Daniel Richardson is out for this game and they will go to Ty Brock here. Remember, Richardson was already the back-up as regular starter David Moore was suspended. The Chips were extremely fortunate to cover last week as they scored 17 points in the final 5 minutes to beat Eastern Michigan (see bad beats page 1). On the other side, Ball St is off an outright upset over Toledo. That score was also misleading as Ball St led 27-9 mid-4Q before the Rockets scored a couple of late TD's. Add those two misleading finals together and you get value on the Cardinals here.

Kent St 36 MIAMI, OH 34. Clearly Kent St was being over-valued in the market coming into last week's game vs Buffalo. The Golden Flashes would get run over allowing 515 rush yards and 70 points. This will be a much better barometer for them. Meanwhile, the defending MAC Champs Miami got a blowout win over Akron in a game, we thought the market was under-valuing the RedHawks (only -14 vs Akron?). They got back QB Brett Gabbert and he delivered with 308 pass yards and 4 TD's. Kent St deserves to be favored but we're not sure we can lay the full FG here. **This game was cancelled right before we went to press on Wednesday morning.**

Buffalo 35 OHIO 26. Last week Buffalo RB Jaret Patterson ran for eight TD's to tie an FBS record and finished with 409 yards rushing, the second-best game in FBS history. Patterson is the first Division I player to rush for more than 300 yards in consecutive games since Texas star Ricky Williams did it in 1996. Last week we thought the market was under-valuing Buffalo but after Patterson's performance and the Bulls' 70 points vs Kent St grabbed national headlines, now we feel they are being over-valued here. Ohio is in their largest home underdog role since 2005. We lean Bobcats.

WESTERN MICHIGAN 38 Eastern Michigan 27. Something was just off with the MAC point-spreads last week and one of them was Western Michigan laying nearly 3 TD's to Northern Illinois. The Broncos struggled and actually trailed by 7 in the 4Q before scoring the game's final 10 points. Meanwhile, EMU is off a misleading loss to Central Michigan as their backers suffered one of the worst beats of the entire weekend (see page 1). We mention this every time EMU is on the road but it is one of the better ATS numbers out there. EMU is 17-2-1 ATS as a road underdog with an average cover of 7 ppg. We lean with them here.

CHARLOTTE 33 FIU 24. Even though we're having a good college season on these pages, it's games like this one that has made it difficult. Who knows what to expect from a Charlotte team who hasn't played since October 31st. Their game vs WKU was post-poned until yesterday and then it was cancelled. Meanwhile, it's been a season to forget for FIU at 0-5 straight up. FIU covered one game this year. It came against Liberty and we had Liberty in that one. That has to be one of the more mind-boggling losses of the entire season. Pass.

MARSHALL 35 Rice 14. We lean with Rice in this one. Marshall is unbeaten this season outscoring their opponents by 28 ppg and are +191 ypg. However, they haven't played the last couple of weeks and you have to wonder if they will be hitting on all cylinders here. Meanwhile, the Owls have only played three games so far but it is tough to get margin on them considering their style of play (slower paced). Their QB Mike Collins does have a 10-to-1 TD-to-INT ratio this season.

Florida 37 TENNESSEE 23. Florida has owned this series going 14-1 SU (+13 ppg) and 10-5 ATS (+5.6 ppg) since 2005. However, we feel this point spread is a bit inflated. Yes, Tennessee has lost 5 straight games and the Volunteers are 0-5 ATS in those games. However, they are off a bye and in their last game outgained Auburn by 79 yards. It was a 100-yard interception return TD that did them in (dreaded 14-point swing). Meanwhile, the Gators have struggled vs Vanderbilt and Kentucky in recent weeks as big favorites.

1★ UTAH 34 Oregon St 20. Bad spot for the Beavers here coming off an emotional upset win over their rival Oregon last Friday. More pertinent to this game is the health status of QB Tristan Gebbia who was hurt in the final minute. Chance Nolan could get his first career start here. Yes, Utah is 0-2 on the season but it is misleading. The Utes were -3 in TO's vs USC and last week blew a 21-0 lead at Washington. They're taking a major step down in class here. Note their rush defense is allowing just 91 ypg and should be up to the task of slowing down Oregon St RB Jermer Jefferson who has 675 rush yards in just 4 games.

2★ Colorado 34 ARIZONA 24. This Colorado team is not getting enough love nationally. The Buffs are 3-0 on the season and honestly don't have a lot of weaknesses. Their offense is led by RB Jarek Broussard who has 3 straight 100-yard game and is averaging 34 ppg. Meanwhile their defense is allowing just 108 rush ypg and shut down San Diego St last week. They're 3-0 ATS and they've beat three capable teams in UCLA, Stanford and San Diego St who are all better than this Arizona team. The Wildcats are 0-3 and could be playing with a freshman QB here in Will Plummer who looked lost in relief of Grant Gunnell last week as we won on these pages fading them.

ARIZONA ST 28 UCLA 26. The Sun Devils have played one game this season after having their last 3 games cancelled. Who will be in and out of their line-up? We're not sure what to expect from them but we did come away impressed with their near upset of USC in the opener. We are very impressed with UCLA so far this season. They've had one bad half of football vs Colorado in the opener and that result looks better as Colorado has proven to be a solid team. Last week we cashed on these pages with the Bruins in their win over Arizona. We expected QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson to return to the line-up but it looks like he will return here. The defense has been the story allowing 100 ypg less than what they did a year ago. Lean Bruins.

NOTRE DAME 44 Syracuse 9. The unbeaten Fighting Irish continue to impress as last week they beat North Carolina 31-17 scoring the game's final 17 points. Considering how good North Carolina's offense is, we thought ND's performance in the second half on defense was the best we've seen out of anyone so far this season. ND has already clinched a berth in the ACC Title game and this is their final regular season game as next week's game vs Wake Forest was cancelled by the ACC last week. The Irish should have a ton of success vs a Syracuse team that hasn't quit on the season as evidence of their 7-point loss vs NC State last week. However, the Orange are severely under-manned and are playing one of the most physical teams in the country. Lean ND.

WASHINGTON 30 Stanford 21. Stanford has relocated their practices to the Pacific Northwest as the COVID protocols are strict in California. The Cardinal got their first win of the season in dramatic fashion last week over rival Cal 24-23 benefiting from a late missed PAT. They're taking on a Washington team that also had a last second win last week as the Huskies rallied from a 21-0 halftime deficit to beat Utah. New UW QB Dylan Morris has been a bit inconsistent so far and we actually lean with Stanford here.

NEVADA 30 Fresno St 24. Nevada's unbeaten season came to an end on the islands last week. Still, the Wolf Pack are having a great season thanks to QB Carson Strong who has a 16-to-2 TD-to-INT ratio. Fresno St had won and covered 3 straight games but each of their last two games has been cancelled due to COVID. Not sure what to expect from them but our power ratings say they are the play here. We also lean UNDER.

Oregon 33 CALIFORNIA 24. The Ducks have really disappointed the last couple of weeks and we will see how they respond here. Last week they got upset by rival Oregon St in the final seconds as their defense allowed 532 yards. They're playing an 0-3 Cal team that is also off a last-minute loss to rival Stanford last week. Cal has shown improvement the last couple of weeks and did out-gain both Oregon St and Stanford in losses. Slight lean on them.

1★ Oklahoma St 28 TCU 23. Gary Patterson estimated his team was "missing close to 40 guys" due to COVID-19 tests, contact tracing and run-of-the-mill injuries last week. Still, they had no issues winning and covering vs Kansas although it should be noted they scored 3 non-offensive TD's which could give us some value here. On the other side, Oklahoma St backers were dealt a tough loss as Texas Tech scored a couple of late TD's to get the back-door and Oklahoma St took a knee instead of scoring late. Again, that creates some value here. Also note TCU has been horrible at home as of late at 8-19-2 ATS (-6 ppg) the last 5 years.

IOWA ST 27 West Virginia 21. A really underrated match-up here with two teams that the "sharps" love betting on. West Virginia saw last week's game vs Oklahoma cancelled due to COVID issues at Oklahoma. The Mountaineers are +169 ypg on the season and have the Big 12's best defense. Meanwhile, Iowa St all but locked up a spot in the Big 12 title game with a dramatic win over Texas last week. "We always say it's a five-star culture vs. five-star players," RB Breece Hall notably said in the post-game. It will be interesting to see how Iowa St handles their business after an emotional win.

Northwestern at Minnesota was cancelled due to COVID issues at Minny. WISCONSIN 30 Indiana 19. The biggest story here is that Indiana QB Michael Penix is out for the season with a torn ACL. Jack Tuttle will get the start here (former 4-star recruit who was 5 for 5 last week). The Hoosiers are 6-0 ATS this season and we think they continue to get disrespect in the market. Meanwhile, Wisconsin has seen 3 of their games cancelled this year and after setting the world on fire in the opener, QB Graham Mertz has come back to Earth the last couple of games. Even with a back-up QB, we lean Indy here.

TEXAS TECH 45 Kansas 20. Kansas is a miserable 0-7-1 ATS this season but we feel this is the first week you are paying a real premium if you want to fade them. The Jayhawks have had many poor seasons in recent memory but this could be their worst team yet as they are -34 ppg and -201 ypg. Meanwhile, Texas Tech is off a cover vs Oklahoma St last week and will want to end the season on a high note here. However, we're not sure we want to lay 4 TD's with a defense allowing 39 ppg and 471 ypg. We do like the OVER which is 7-0-1 ATS in Kansas games this year.

Toledo 34 NORTHERN ILLINOIS 25. This Northern Illinois team has been underrated in the market the last couple of weeks as they have nearly pulled outright upsets as big underdogs vs Ball St and Western Michigan. Meanwhile, Toledo just suffered an outright upset as a 10-point favorite last week to Ball St. The 27-24 final wasn't as close as it appeared as UT scored a couple of late TD's. We lean with Northern Illinois here.

OKLAHOMA 42 Baylor 20. Oklahoma was one of the hottest teams in the country with 5 straight wins by 28 ppg and 5 straight covers by 14 ppg. However, their game vs West Virginia was cancelled last week as the Sooners are dealing with COVID issues. They are short-handed on their coaching staff to the point former head coach Bob Stoops has helped them this week. They're playing a Baylor team off a last-second win over Kansas St last week. With much uncertainty on the OU side, we don't see much value right now.

2★ Auburn (plus the points) Texas A&M 27 AUBURN 24. We felt Texas A&M was a Top 10 team coming into the season and we still think they're a Top 10 team right now (see power ratings). However, this line is giving them way too much respect. Look the Aggies beat Florida at home and crushed a South Carolina team that was getting ready to wave the white flag on head coach Will Muschamp. Last week, they weren't that impressive vs LSU as the two teams both had 267 yards. Meanwhile, Auburn was crushed by Alabama but the Tigers were "only" -98 yards vs the best team in the country. Auburn has won 3 straight in this series and head coach Gus Malzahn is usually worth one surprise win each year. Note the Tigers are 6-1 ATS as a home underdog the last 5 years with an average cover of 13 ppg. They've won 5 of those 7 games outright!

Texas 30 KANSAS ST 23. After last week's loss to Iowa St, we've seen a couple of key Texas players opt out of the season including safety Cade Sterns and OT Samuel Cosmi. How much will they be motivated here? Kansas St has lost 4 straight games but they won't give up here. They, like Iowa St last week have much better culture than the Longhorns. The Wildcats are 12-3-1 ATS vs Texas (+9 ppg) since 1998 and have covered 7 straight as a home underdog.

Iowa 33 ILLINOIS 17. We mention this stat often but Iowa is 23-1 SU (+17 ppg) and 19-4-1 ATS (+11 ppg) as road favorites since late 2011. They're consistent in that they run the ball, don't turn it over and play good defense. They've now won 4 straight since starting 0-2. Illinois is better than their record and stats since they played a couple games with a 4th-string QB. However, this line is giving them way too much credit.

Hawaii at San Jose St was moved to Hawaii and is on the next page.

† **Wyoming 34 New Mexico 16.** Played at Sam Boyd Stadium in Las Vegas. "In my honest opinion, we're a terrible football team. I think we're a very, very mentally weak football team." Those are the words of New Mexico head coach Danny Gonzales after the Lobos fell to 0-5 in an upset loss to Utah St last Thursday. That doesn't inspire much confidence in wanting to bet on them and neither does their QB situation as they could be down to a 3rd stringer here. Meanwhile, Wyoming just crushed UNLV in Las Vegas last Friday and should do the same here.

SAN DIEGO ST 29 Colorado St 20. We haven't seen Colorado St the last couple of weeks but they had a misleading blowout loss to Boise St thanks to 3 special teams TD's by the Broncos in their last game. Meanwhile, San Diego St has already played 6 games and is off back-to-back close losses on the road to Nevada and Colorado. We lean San Diego St.

TULANE 31 Memphis 30. Tulane comes in off a bye. At 5-5, they need a win to achieve a winning season. They had covered 5 straight games but their backers suffered a really bad in their last game as they fell to Tulsa in double-overtime by 6 (were 5-point dogs). On the other side, what was that? Last week's Memphis' offense only managed 10 points but their defense limited Navy to 7 as the UNDER hit by 46.5 points. They are just 2-6 ATS under first-year coach Ryan Silverfield.

Tulsa 31 NAVY 21. Tulsa has only played 6 games so far and had last week's game vs Houston cancelled. They should get back QB Zach Smith here after he went down in the Tulane game a couple weeks ago. The Golden Hurricane are 5-0 in AAC play but we feel they are overrated. They have come-from-behind to win four times this year facing double-digit deficits and were extremely fortunate to win the games vs East Carolina and Tulane. On the other side, we also feel Navy is overrated but give them credit for a close loss to Memphis last week. Slight lean Navy.

Troy 27 SOUTH ALABAMA 26. We don't understand the line move on Troy here unless its because USA QB Desmond Trotter is hurt more serious than what is being reported right now. He was 16 of 22 for 242 yards and 2 TD's in last week's upset win over Arkansas St but hurt his ankle and didn't return. Tanner McGee was 6 of 8 for 145 yards and 2 TD's replacing him. Meanwhile, Troy has lost 3 straight and failed to cover in all 3 as their offense has come to a screeching halt. Lean South Alabama.

ARKANSAS ST 45 UL-Monroe 21. Series domination! Arkansas St is on a 10-0 SU (+20 ppg) and 10-0 ATS (+12 ppg) run vs UL-Monroe since 2010. Arkansas St needs a feel good win after being outright upset in the last two weeks. The Red Wolves who started 3-2 have lost 5 straight! Meanwhile, ULM is making a strong case for worst team in CFB this year at 0-9 straight up and off a 70-20 loss to ULL. Another win and cover ASt.

MISSOURI 28 Arkansas 24. You have to think the winner of this game likely gets SEC head coach of the year. Both first-year coaches have far exceeded expectations. Arkansas comes in off a bye after dropping 2 straight (also 0-2 ATS in those last two games after starting 6-0 ATS). Meanwhile Missouri has won and covered four of their last 5 games including a beat down of Vanderbilt last week. Slight lean on the home team here.

SMU 35 Houston 34. We're not sure what happened to SMU last week as they were handled by East Carolina 52-38 as 12.5-point favorites. That's now 2 straight losses for them after starting the season 7-1. How motivated will they be here? If they are, they seem like the play. The Mustangs are

playing a Houston team that hasn't played in a few weeks and is mediocre in our opinion. Wrong team favored here. We'll take SMU.

Alabama 47 LSU 18. This is the biggest underdog role in the history of LSU football. The Tigers are 7-3 ATS all-time catching 17 or more points. Their opponent Alabama has covered 5 straight games and the Crimson Tide are +30 ppg and +178 ypg on the season despite playing an all-SEC schedule. QB Mac Jones has a 23-to-3 TD-to-INT ratio, RB Najee Harris is closing in on 1,000 yards and WR DeVonta Smith is the best in CFB 1,074 yards and 12 TD's. Meanwhile, LSU is a shell of its former self. We'd favor last year's LSU team by 30 over this year's team and the Tigers just lost another player to opt out in their best player Terrace Marshall (10 receiving TD's). Bama rolls but we can't lay this number.

Miami, FL 37 DUKE 23. This game was just added with Florida St's trip to Duke being cancelled. The Hurricanes have been off the last couple of weeks as they were hit hard by COVID. It's been a nice season for them at 7-1 but it doesn't look like they have a good shot of getting to the ACC Championship game now that the ACC cancelled games for Clemson and Notre Dame next week. Meanwhile, its been a season to forget for Duke at 2-7. There will probably be value on their NEXT YEAR as they are only -20 ypg because of a -13 TO margin. Not sure we want to lay more than 14 with what could be a rusty Miami team.

HAWAII 29 San Jose St 28. This game just got flipped here yesterday as San Jose St and most California schools are going to struggle to host games due to the state's strict COVID policies. San Jose has already seen its last two games cancelled and it has to be disappointing for them as they are 4-0 for the first time since 1955. Meanwhile, Hawaii is off an upset win over previously unbeaten Nevada last week. Hawaii QB Chevan Cordeiro was 26 of 32 for 246 yards and a 1-0 ratio while also running for 62 yards and a TD. Down to the wire but we currently don't see value.

NORTH CAROLINA 59 Western Carolina 10. North Carolina needs a feel good win after getting dominated by Notre Dame in the second half last week. It was the first time NC had lost a game by a two-possession margin since head coach Mack Brown returned. The Tar Heels' previous eight losses were all by seven or fewer points. Won't have to worry about that here vs a Western Carolina team that is 0-2 this fall getting outscored by an average of 54-16 and outgained by an average of 612-269.

Sunday, December 6th

Uab 30 MIDDLE TENNESSEE 20. We're supposed to be the CFB experts but who really knows what to expect from UAB who hasn't played since Halloween. We've actually been disappointed with them so far this season at 2-5 ATS and in their last game they were upset as 13-point favorites to Louisiana Tech. Meanwhile, Middle Tennessee has rebounded from a poor start to cover 5 of their last 7 games and notch 3 wins in the process but they've only played two games since October 24th. We lean OVER.

USC 38 Washington St 27. USC saw last week's game vs Colorado cancelled due to COVID issues at USC and the two teams postponed this game back two days to get extra time to prep as Washington St has also seen its last two games cancelled. We have not been impressed with USC at all despite their 3-0 record and with Wazzu getting back QB Jayden de Laura here, we would lean with the Cougars. Nice to get some Sunday Night CFB action especially when DEN at KC could be a blowout.

Week 14 Computer Projected Lines for Every CFB Game

For the past four seasons we have posted computer projected lines for every game. **Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 302-252-12 (55%) clip the last three years.** That's pretty solid and actually better than our own handicapping in some seasons. **Last week's plays went 6-3 and now the record for this year is 52-40.** Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 12 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **Auburn +7.**

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

Week 14 CFB ATS Trends

1. Appalachian St is a perfect 8-0 SU vs UL-Lafayette winning those games by an average of 19 ppg. This week they are only 2.5-point home favorites.
2. Clemson is on 25-1 SU (+33 ppg) and 20-6 ATS (+7 ppg) vs ACC foes. The one loss and two recent non-covers came when QB Lawrence was out. This week the Tigers are 22-point road favorites at Va Tech.
3. Virginia Tech is a 22-point home underdog this week to Clemson. That's their largest home dog role since 1988 (+22 vs South Carolina).
4. Akron has lost 21 straight games by an average of 25 ppg. The Zips are just 4-17 ATS in those 21 games failing to cover by an average of 9 ppg. Still, Akron is a 3-point home favorite vs Bowling Green this week.
5. Ohio is a 11.5-point home underdog to Buffalo this week. That's the largest home underdog role for the Bobcats since 2005.
6. Eastern Michigan is on a 17-2-1 ATS run as a road underdog. This week the Eagles are 13.5-point underdogs at Western Michigan.
7. Florida is 14-1 SU (+13 ppg) and 10-5 ATS (+5.6 ppg) vs Tennessee since 2005. This week the Gators are 17-point favorites at Tennessee.
8. TCU is on a 8-19-2 ATS run at home the last 5 years. This week TCU is a 2.5-point home underdog to Ok St.
9. Wisconsin is 10-0 SU (+36 ppg) and 8-1-1 ATS (+19 ppg) vs Indiana since 2005. This week the Badgers are 14-point home favorites.
10. Auburn is 6-1 ATS as a home underdog the last 5 years with an average cover of 13 ppg. They've won 5 of those 7 games outright. This week they're 7-point underdogs to Texas A&M.

13. Series domination! Arkansas St is 10-0 SU (+20 ppg) and 10-0 ATS (+12 ppg) vs UL-Monroe. This week the Red Wolves are 21-point home favorites.
14. LSU is a 29.5-point underdog to Alabama this week. That's the largest underdog role in the history of LSU football.

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

The Baltimore at Pittsburgh game from last week was postponed and will be played on the day we release this week's newsletter. We had Pittsburgh winning by 3 originally but that was with Lamar Jackson in the line-up. With him out and bunch of other Ravens players out and limited practice time, our new forecast would have the Steelers 24-13 so we lean UNDER.

Sunday, December 6th

CHICAGO 23 Detroit 20. We guess in the end, Rocket Scientists don't make good head football coaches as the Lions finally fired Matt Patricia after another lousy Thanksgiving performance. Meanwhile Chicago head coach Matt Nagy could be next in line as the Bears have lost 5 straight and were crushed by the Packers on SNF. It is worth noting that Chicago QB Mitch Trubisky has a 12-to-1 TD-to-INT vs the Lions in his career and threw three 4Q TD passes to beat them in the opener this year. However, the Lions have the rest edge.

MIAMI 26 Cincinnati 16. This is the largest favorite role for the Dolphins since 2003. They have done well so far this season laying more than a TD with easy wins and covers over the Jets including last week. In our opinion, if they want to win now, Fitzpatrick is the better option than rookie Tua Tagovailoa. Meanwhile, the Bengals got a nice cover vs the Giants last week in their first game without Joe Burrow as Brandon Allen was okay considering the low expectations. Despite their 2-8-1 record, the Bengals are 7-3-1 ATS this season but in one possession games they are 1-13-1 (sign of bad coaching). Yes, Miami is 6-1 ATS their last 7 games but we lean Cincy here.

Indianapolis 27 HOUSTON 24. A lot of money came in against the Colts last week and it proved correct as they were easily handled at home to the Titans. The Colts have been favored in every game but one this year despite playing four straight playoff caliber teams. They're taking on a Houston team that has extra rest after their Thanksgiving win and cover over the Lions. However, they lost WR Will Fuller for the rest of the season due to PED's along with CB Bradley Robey. QB Deshaun Watson in his last 6 games has 16 total TD's and ZERO TO's. Only Mahomes is playing better than him at this point. Don't see much value though here.

MINNESOTA 32 Jacksonville 21. Minnesota disappointed us on these pages last week as they only beat Carolina by 1. They still have faint playoff hopes but its tough laying points with losing teams. They're taking on a Jacksonville team that has lost 10 straight games but have covered 3 of their last 4. Still, the Jags are a horrific 6-25 ATS vs NFC teams since 2012 failing to cover by 7 ppg.

Las Vegas 28 N.Y. JETS 18. That was one of our easiest winners ever on these pages as last week the Falcons crushed the Raiders as 3-point underdogs. That makes this game essential for the Raiders if they want to remain in the playoff hunt. Since 1989, when teams fail to cover the spread by 28 points or more, they rebound to the tune of 158-121-9 (56.6%) the following week. That's what we're banking on here as the lowly Jets are now 0-11 SU and 3-8 ATS on the season. It's clear now that Sam Darnold along with Adam Gase are not the answers.

1★ Atlanta (plus the points) New Orleans 24 ATLANTA 23. Just two weeks ago, Atlanta was catching 3.5-points at New Orleans (lost 24-9) and now they're 3-point home underdogs?!? Obviously, that was an easy winner for us backing them on these pages last week in their blowout win over the Raiders. We've said it before, they are a Todd Gurley mental error away from being 5-1 SU under interim coach Raheem Morris. Please note teams that cover the spread by 35 or more points (ATL) are often over-valued in the market the next week. Since 2013, those teams are just 5-16 ATS. Meanwhile, the Saints took advantage of a Denver team playing a rookie WR at QB last week. During the past 11 seasons, when two division teams play each other twice in a 3-week span, the team that lost the first matchup is 19-4 ATS in the rematch. That's good enough for us.

1★ Cleveland (plus the points) TENNESSEE 27 Cleveland 24. If the playoffs started today the Titans would be the No. 3 seed and the Browns would be the No. 5 seed. The Titans crushed the Browns in last year's season opener but this is a much better coached Cleveland teams as the Browns have won 3 straight games. QB Baker Mayfield hasn't thrown an INT in his last 4 games and the Browns have the No. 1 rush offense. The look ahead line for this was Tennessee -3.5. There's been too much of an adjustment from last week. The Titans are just 2-5 ATS as favorites this year.

SEATTLE 28 N.Y. Giants 19. As of presstime we don't know who is going to start at QB for the Giants as Daniel Joens went down in last week's game vs Cincinnati with a hamstring injury. Meanwhile, Seattle is on a short week after Monday's win over the Eagles which some of you suffered a horrific beat in the final seconds backing them. The Seahawks are 5-0 at home this year but their average MOV is only 6 ppg. The NFC East leading Giants have covered 8 straight games as a road dog and as long as they're getting 10 here, we lean with them.

L.A. Rams 28 ARIZONA 24. Both teams are coming off 3-point losses last week losing outright as favorites and both need this game. The Cardinals have now lost 4 straight games ATS and their playoff hopes are dwindling. Meanwhile, we cashed on these pages fading the Rams last week in their loss to the 49ers. Still, it should be noted L.A. is +92 ypg on the season...that's better than the unbeaten 10-0 Steelers and better than the defending Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs. The Rams are 6-0 SU and ATS vs the Cardinals the last 3 years.

GREEN BAY 29 Philadelphia 19. At least the Eagles made some of their backers some money on Monday as they got the last second miracle backdoor cover. There's not much to like about this team and it's mind-boggling they don't lead a terrible NFC East division. Meanwhile, the Packers got an easy win over the Bears. Doesn't get much more disparate than GB's Aaron Rodgers 33-4 TD-to-INT ratio (league high TD's) and 11 sacks vs Carson Wentz' 16-to-15 ratio (league high INT's) and league-high 46 sacks. The Packers would be a good teaser option down to -2.5.

New England 23 L.A. CHARGERS 22. This is arguably the biggest coaching mismatch of all time! You have the best ever in Bill Belichick vs the clueless Chargers' coaches. Did you see the clock management in those final 45 seconds vs the Bills last week? It doesn't get any worse than that. You also have Belichick vs a rookie QB. So why aren't the Pats listed as a best bet? Last week they only gained 179 yards and they've been incredibly inconsistent. They are -5 ypg on the season and the Chargers are +55.

KANSAS CITY 33 Denver 20. The Chiefs are 10-1 SU on the season but the point spread tax has finally caught up to them (3 straight non-covers) after cashing tickets left and right for nearly a full season dating back to last year. Denver basically played with two arms tied behind their backs last week as they had to start rookie WR Kendall Hinton at QB due to contact tracing in their QB room. KC is on a 10-0 SU (+16 ppg) and 8-1-1 ATS (+10 ppg) run in the series but we don't want to lay 2 TD's here. Lean OVER.

Monday, December 7th

1★ San Francisco 24 Buffalo 23. Game got moved to Arizona due to COVID issues in California. We'd normally say that's a slight edge to SF who is used to playing at the site every year but the Bills just played here a couple weeks ago (Hail Mary loss to the Cardinals). The Bills won and covered last week vs a woefully inept Chargers coaching staff. They won't have the same advantage here as the 49ers got new life with an upset win over the Rams. Despite their 8-3 record, Buffalo is just +1 ppg and -1 ypg on the season. Meanwhile, 5-6 San Francisco is +1 ppg but +48 ypg. We like the 49ers.

PITTSBURGH 26 Washington 18. Tough writing a forecast for this one without knowing the results of the Wednesday afternoon Baltimore/Pittsburgh game. The 10-0 Steelers haven't got much respect in the market as they are 8-2 ATS. Washington will have a huge rest advantage having played on Thanksgiving the week before. The Redskins crushed the Cowboys and should be playing with confidence. Only a few places have this line up currently. We would take +10 with Washington and lay -6.5 with Pittsburgh. We're guessing the line falls somewhere in the middle.

Tuesday, December 8th

BALTIMORE 30 Dallas 20. Do the Ravens get back Lamar Jackson and Company for this game? How did Baltimore perform vs Pittsburgh on Wednesday afternoon? The Cowboys will have a huge rest advantage having played on Thanksgiving (albeit a crushing loss to Washington) and how motivated will Dallas be down the stretch. If Jackson is cleared, we would list the Ravens as double-digit favorites.

In our opinion, your best 6-point teaser options would be Las Vegas -2, Green Bay -2.5, and San Francisco +8.5.
