To all who are loved by God and called to be his holy people: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the LORD

Jesus Christ. Romans 1:7 (NIV) As I ponder this morning, I realize how close we are to the end of year and more importantly, how close we are to Advent and celebrating the birth of Jesus. During this time, we often get caught up in the secular excitement about buying and receiving presents, forgetting what the birth of Jesus truly means. So, how do we keep focused on Jesus? What do you do to remember the true reason for the season?

As Christians we are blessed to start the season with Advent. What is this experience called ADVENT? The purpose of Advent is to prepare spiritually for the coming of Jesus Christ at

Christmas. Here are some scripture readings for you to "connect the dots."

- 1. Genesis 3:15 where God spoke to Satan.
- 2. The last chapter of Malachi in the Old Testament and the first chapter of Luke in the New Testament.

Why would I ask you to read those chapters? Luke began his gospel where Malachi left off! The final words of the Old Testament speak of the one who would "Prepare the way of the Lord."



Here is a challenge for you:

Start with Malachi 4:1-6. This sets the stage for the coming of Jesus. And then tackle Luke 1:1-80; it is ok to read it in smaller bites. The first chapter of Luke is filled with preparation: the birth of John the Baptist was foretold (1-25); the birth of Jesus was foretold (26-38); Mary visits Elizabeth (39-45); Mary's Song of Praise (46-56); the birth of John the Baptist (57-66); and Zechariah's Prophecy (67-80). With those two chapters Malachi 4 and Luke 1, you will have prepared yourself for the coming of Jesus.

In addition to the reading above, pay attention to what is going on during the season of Advent followed with Christmas and Epiphany. The first Sunday of Advent is November 28. Advent continues through December 19. We also will have a "Blue Christmas" service on December 8 at 7:00 p.m.

Our Christmas Eve service is on December 24. Earlier in the day of Christmas Eve, Community Presbyterian Church will be serving a Christmas dinner at the Salvation Army in Fargo. This has been a tradition for many years. They have asked if we would sing Christmas songs during dinner. Do you love to sing Christmas songs? Please consider coming to help with the dinner with your voice this year! We also have a tradition at Community Presbyterian Church of having a Christmas Day service at 10:00 a.m. We know it is not always convenient to step away for an hour on Christmas Day. However, please seriously consider giving God your time during the morning of Christmas Day.

> The first Sunday of Christmas is December 26, the last service of 2021! It is another opportunity to worship the birth of Jesus.

> You have probably noticed that we have combined December and January for this newsletter. We have walked

through December together. Now it is time to turn to January. The second Sunday of Christmas is January 2. We will celebrate communion on January 9, with the Baptism of the Lord. January 16 is the 2nd Sunday *after* Epiphany followed by January 23, the Third Sunday *after* Epiphany, and January 30, the 4th Sunday *after* Epiphany.

Not sure just what "Epiphany" means? The word comes from Greek, meaning "manifestation" or appearance. Epiphany was an ancient feast day and is often referred to as the "twelfth night" or the 12th day of Christmas. Epiphany marks the official end of Christmas.

Blessings to you and your loved ones during your preparation and celebration of Christmas.


