The Way of the Cross

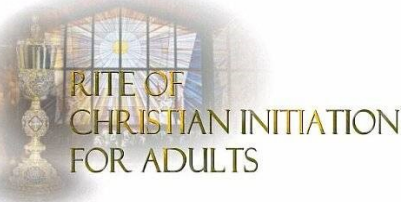

Rite of Lenten Renewal

For the last several months, a group of candidates have been exploring their faith with the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) team members here at St. Augustine's. They will gather together February 26th at the 7:00pm Mass for the Rite of Lenten Renewal. We ask that you continue to pray for these candidates Michael, Emily, Victor, Luciano and Michael, as they continue on their journey to becoming full members of our faith community.



What is holding you back from experiencing the fullness of a true loving relationship with God? Throughout Lent a box will be at the entrance to St. Augustine's for your prayer petitions. Bring your petitions with you and place in the sealed box. This box and contents will be burnt in the Easter Vigil fire, symbolizing our entering into the Easter season with a clean heart.

OUR LADY OF MERCY ~ THE IMPORTANCE OF A CHURCH MISSION

At the last meeting of our Pastoral Council of Our Lady of Mercy, on Monday January 30, 2023, our council voted unanimously on adopting the Greater Shediac Community Garden Inc. as our church mission *for the next twelve months*. Last year, due to unfortunate circumstances, the **Community Garden lost access** to the land that had been used for 12 years. The garden is a staple of our community and used to provide food for the needy and a growing space for all those who need a garden space. The dismantling of the garden represents a great loss for our community.

During the process, most of the wood used for the raised beds was lost due to damages. The garden has recently secured a new location and a lease with the French school district at the back of LJR high school. The cost of rebuilding "From the ground up" will cost an estimated 120,000.00 in materials and tools. It would be wonderful for our church community to aim at raising 10% of this cost, in support of the needy in our community! In the next few weeks, a fundraising chart will be installed at the entrance of our church. An amount of 2500.00 has already been donated by an individual, bringing our goal down to \$9,500.00!



St Lawrence O'Toole is starting a parish mission to help the needy in their area, St Augustine already supports Ray of Hope Kitchen, St Vincent de Paul Society, and helps with the school lunch program at Beaverbrook.

Together, we can all make a huge difference in our community! For the next year, special envelopes will be available for donations & fundraising events will also be organized for this cause. Your generosity is always appreciated! The garden will also welcome anyone willing to volunteer as well as the donation of gardening tools, made available for gardeners. The garden welcomes all to become members!

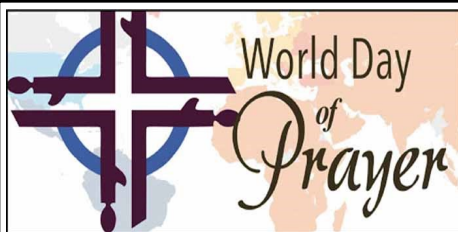

The Common Good

Our Catholic faith offers us genuine solutions to our problems. Our faith has principles which guide us through the most complicated of problems and situations.

IV. THE PRINCIPLE OF THE COMMON GOOD

156. An integral ecology is inseparable from the notion of the common good, a central and unifying principle of social ethics. The common good is “the sum of those conditions of social life which allow social groups and their individual members relatively thorough and ready access to their own fulfilment”.^[122]

157. Underlying the principle of the common good is respect for the human person as such, endowed with basic and inalienable rights ordered to his or her integral development. It has also to do with the overall welfare of society and the development of a variety of intermediate groups, applying the principle of subsidiarity. Outstanding among those groups is the family, as the basic cell of society. Finally, the common good calls for social peace, the stability and security provided by a certain order which cannot be achieved without particular concern for distributive justice; whenever this is violated, violence always ensues. Society as a whole, and the state in particular, are obliged to defend and promote the common good.

158. In the present condition of global society, where injustices abound and growing numbers of people are deprived of basic human rights and considered expendable, the principle of the common good immediately becomes, logically and inevitably, a summons to solidarity and a preferential option for the poorest of our brothers and sisters. This option entails recognizing the implications of the universal destination of the world's goods, but, as I mentioned in the Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium*,^[123] it demands before all else an appreciation of the immense dignity of the poor in the light of our deepest convictions as believers. We need only look around us to see that, today, this option is in fact an ethical imperative essential for effectively attaining the common good.
